DEDICATION

The outstanding operational success of the N.C.2A Cross Country Championships, from its first year to and including this the Ninth Annual Show, has been and is primarily due to the unselfish hard work and the meticulous attention to details of Lauren P. Brown, Cross Country Coach and Assistant Track Coach at Michigan State College from the Fall of 1931, to the Spring of 1947 inclusive.

Brownie competed in outstanding fashion at MSC as an undergraduate in both Cross Country and Track. That he won his share of honors is amply attested to by the fact that he was privileged to serve as Captain of both squads. His work as a Coach was outstanding; he developed not once but repeatedly both individual and team champions of the Central Collegiates, the I.C.4A and the N.C.2A. He is one of the founders of the National Collegiate Cross Country Association. Since the birth of that organization on November 28, 1938, he has served as Secretary and Statistician "extraordinary." His work for the Association is as meticulously painstaking and detailed as has been his conduct of the preceding eight N.C.2A Cross Country Championships.

Since graduation in 1931, Lauren Brown has served as head of the Mimeograph Department at Michigan State College. The rapid growth of the College has so greatly increased the load of work in his Department that it now requires his full time. He will be sorely missed as an active Coach. We feel, however, that Brown will never sever his connection with Cross Country and Distance Running. He still ~~is~~ and carries a stop watch. It is fortunate for us that we, who are responsible for this program and the National Collegiate Meet, can channel most of the work through the Mimeograph Department. That procedure seems to avoid mistakes.

With deep appreciation for past work and present unselfish help, this program is dedicated to Lauren P. Brown.

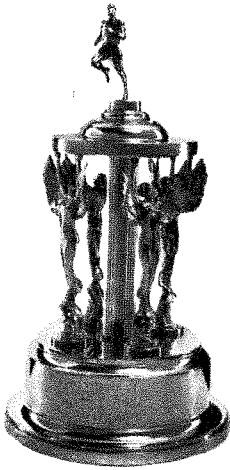

E. C. "Billy" Hayes
N. C. A. A.
Cross Country
Memorial Trophy



The late E. C. "Billy" Hayes, one of the founders of the National Collegiate Athletic Association Cross Country Championships and, subsequently, of the National Collegiate Cross Country Coaches Association, was for nearly twenty years a coach at Indiana University. During the later years of his life he was accorded general recognition as one of America's most effective developers of distance runners. Billy Hayes was president of the National Collegiate Cross Country Coaches Association in 1939. He died on December 13, 1943.

To help perpetuate the memory of his friend, The E. C. "Billy" Hayes N.C.A.A. Cross Country Memorial Trophy is the personal gift of Mr. L. G. Balfour of Attleboro, Massachusetts, an alumnus of Indiana University. This handsome trophy, which Mr. Balfour in 1945 placed in the custody of the N.C.C.C.A., is presented each year to the winner of the team championship at the N.C.A.A. Cross Country Championships. The institution whose team wins the championship has the right to retain the trophy for display on its campus for a limited period, after which the trophy is returned to the Secretary of the N.C.C.C.A. to have the names of the winning team members, along with that of their coach, engraved on the base of the trophy. Although the winning team each year must relinquish the Memorial Trophy in due time to its successor, it receives from Mr. Balfour a replica of the Trophy as a permanent possession.

The honor of winning this distinction each of the two years the trophy has been competed for has gone to Drake University of Des. Moines, Iowa.

In appreciation of his contribution to Cross Country, Michigan State College has named Mr. Balfour as Honorary Referee of the N.C.A.A. Cross Country Championships for as long as the meet is sponsored by that college.

CONTESTANT'S NUMBERS—Numbers to identify contestants must be worn on both the front and back of each contestant's shirt so as to be perfectly visible to opponents, officials, and spectators at all times during the race.

RESULTS OF THE MEET—The results of the meet will be posted on scoreboard in the main lobby of the Jenison Field House immediately after the run.

PRIZES—Trophies will be awarded to first and second place teams. Individual medals will be awarded the first fifteen men to finish. The first five members of the first, second, and third place teams also shall receive medals. Prizes will be distributed from the main ticket window in the lobby of the Jenison Gymnasium.

PUBLIC ADDRESS SYSTEM—The Public Address System is operated through the courtesy of the College Radio Station, WKAR. Positions of the runners as they finish will be announced over the Public Address System by the Announcer, Prof. King J. McCristal.

RESULTS OF PREVIOUS NATIONAL COLLEGIATE CROSS COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIPS

Since inception of the National Collegiate Cross Country Championships in 1938, the meet has been held each year over the Michigan State College Four Mile Cross Country course in East Lansing. 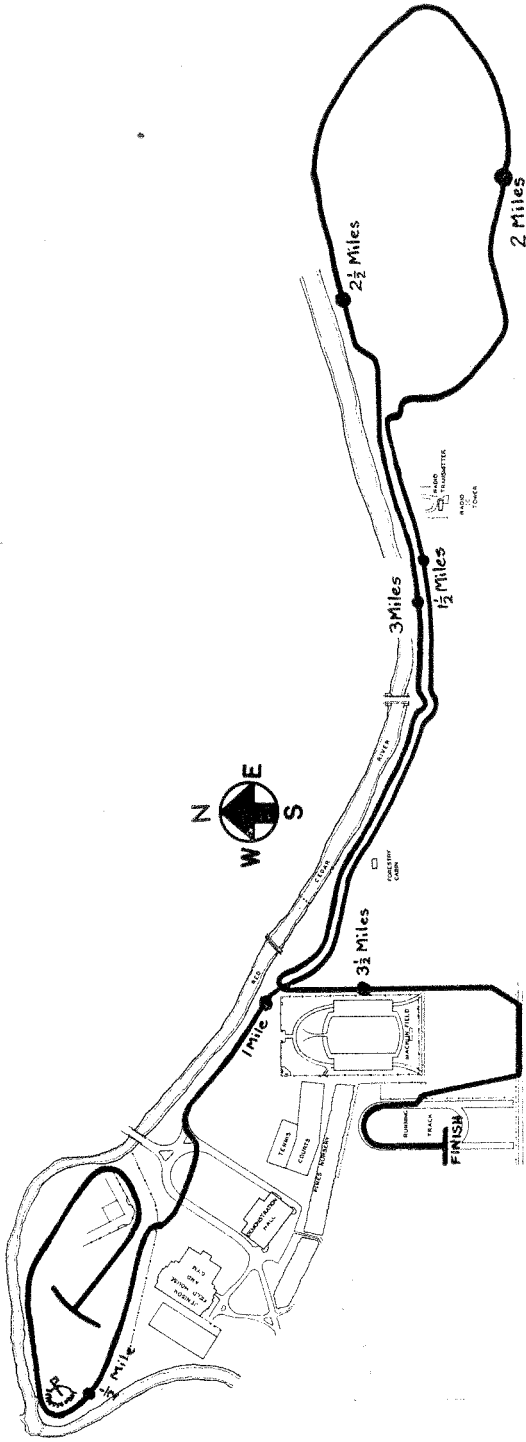

THE COURSE—Starting on the practice field by the baseball diamond, the course takes a long loop around the entire playing area and then leads east past Macklin Field, along the River Road and across Farm

Lane to the college sugar bush. After following the service road on a broad loop through the sugar bush for nearly a mile, the course returns by the same route to Macklin Field and then turns left (south) continuing parallel to the fence line on the east side of the stadium. From the south-east corner of Macklin Field the course swings on a short loop over on to Shaw Lane and then directly to the east gate of the running track. From here the course is on the track finishing at the quarter-mile finish post, a distance of 266 yards.

TEAM SCORING: N.C.A.A. rules on the scoring of Cross Country runs will be followed.

No more than seven contestants from each college actually participate.

Five contestants must finish to give a college a team score.

In determining team score, the winning runner counts 1 point; second place, 2 points; third place, 3 points; and so on. Individuals who do not represent a scoring team forfeit their scoring positions when the team score of the other runners is being determined.

Only the first five representatives of any college to finish shall count in the team score but the sixth and seventh runners, although not scoring points toward their own team's total, hold their places and, if these places are better than those of any of the first five runners of an opposing team, serve thereby to increase the score of the opponent.

The team which scores the smallest total of points shall be the winner.

In case the total points scored by two or more teams shall result in a tie, the event shall be called a tie.
