A BIT OF HISTORY

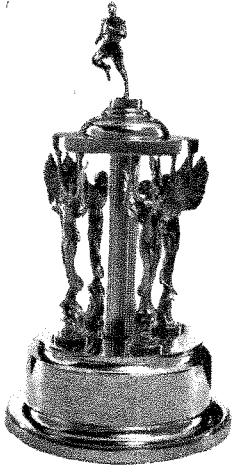
This little brochure is a combined program of two functions: The National Collegiate Athletic Association Cross Country Championships and the annual meeting of the National Collegiate Cross Country Coaches Association. It is fitting, therefore, that a bit of space be allotted to history of both organizations.

In 1926 the Central Intercollegiate Conference held its first Cross Country Championships right here at Michigan State College. This meet proved to be a popular event so Michigan State College continued to sponsor it year after year. In the early thirties the C.I.C. changed its name to Central Collegiate Conference, and welcomed participation of college Cross Country teams from all over the midwest.

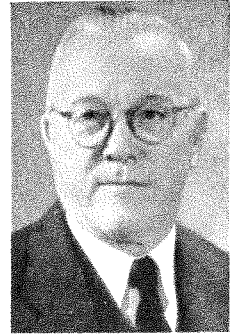
As the event grew in size Michigan State College officials in charge of the meet started the practice of holding, on the night before the championship race, a dinner for the coaches of the visiting teams. At one of these dinners a roll call disclosed the fact that the C.C.C. meet had become more than just a sectional affair; it was almost national in appeal to Cross Country competition. The idea of having a Cross Country meet of truly national character was conceived that night. Within six months an announcement of the First National Collegiate Athletic Association Cross Country Championships, under the sponsorship of Michigan State College, was formally released. Monday's meet is the Eleventh Annual N.C.A.A. Cross Country Championships.

That there was a need for such a meet was established the very first year. Alfred University and Pennsylvania State College were represented, so the meet immediately got off to a good start as an intersectional event. As the years passed, more and more teams came until, by the time the Ninth Annual Meeting rolled around, there were representatives from colleges located on all four borders of the Nation. The National Collegiate had arrived; it was truly national in scope, and has remained that way. It is significant that this growth was achieved in less than ten years of meet competition.

Just as the idea for a national meet grew out of the pre-meet dinners, so grew the idea that there was need for an association of Cross Country coaches. The dinner which preceeded the First Annual N.C.A.A. meet was the occasion of the creation of such an organization. Precedent had been established by the National Collegiate Track Coaches Association which was an outgrowth of coaches meetings at the N.C.A.A. Track and Field Championships each spring, so it was only natural that a name was adopted in line with that of the older organization. Annual meetings have preceeded the N.C.A.A. Cross Country meet each year so tonight we mark the eleventh anniversary of the formation of the National Collegiate Cross Country Coaches' Association. Officers for the current year are: Dan Kinsey, Oberlin, President; George Marshall, Michigan Normal, Vice-President; Lauren P. Brown, Michigan State, Secretary; Guy Sundt, Wisconsin, Treasurer.

E. C. "Billy" Hayes
N. C. A. A.
Cross Country
Memorial Trophy



Any who are familiar with the history of Cross Country running in the United States will know, without benefit of this short resume, of the contribution to the sport of the late E. C. "Billy" Hayes. But it is inevitable that there will be those, not only among the spectators but among the contestants themselves, who are not familiar with the work of this man. His proteges were famous, and there has not been an Olympic Championship since World War I that a Hayes-coached runner hasn't ably represented the U.S.A. Billy, himself, was an Olympic coach in 1932 and in 1936, handling the distance runners.

Billy Hayes was one of the founders of the N.C.A.A. Cross Country Championships, and also of the National Collegiate Cross Country Coaches Association. He was president of the N.C.C.C.A. in 1939. After a lifetime of coaching, nearly twenty years of which were spent at Indiana University where he met with his greatest success as one of America's most effective developers of distance runners, Billy died on December 13, 1943.

To help perpetuate the memory of Billy Hayes, a handsome trophy was donated by his good friend, L. G. Balfour of Attleboro, Massachusetts, an alumnus of Indiana University. In 1945 Mr. Balfour placed his trophy in the custody of the N.C.C.C.A. with the understanding that it be presented each year to the winner of the team championship at the N.C.A.A. Cross Country Championships. The institution whose team wins the championship has the right to retain the trophy for display on its campus for a limited period, after which the trophy is returned to the Secretary of the N.C.C.C.A. to have the names of the winning team members, along with that of their coach, engraved on the base of the trophy.

In appreciation of his contribution to Cross Country, the National Collegiate Cross Country Coaches Association at its 1947 meeting by unanimous vote recommended that Mr. Balfour shall be named as Honorary Referee for all future National Collegiate Cross Country Championships during his lifetime.

As the contestants pass by each half mile post out on the course, the time and positions of the runners in the lead will be flashed to your announcer on the Public Address system.

This service is by courtesy of the Military Department, and is sponsored by Pi Tau Pi Sigma, National Honorary Signal Corps Fraternity. The equipment used is U. S. Signal Corps Radio, Model 300.

GENERAL INFORMATION

START AND FINISH OF RUN—On varsity baseball field north of Jenison Field House. The race starts at 11:30 a.m., E.S.T.

BEST N.C.A.A. CHAMPIONSHIP 4-MILE TIME TO DATE—19:52.3 by Robert Black, Rhode Island State, '50, in 1948.

RECORD FOR PRESENT COURSE—20:24.0 by Warren O. Druetzler, Michigan State '51, 1949.

CONTESTANT'S NUMBERS—Numbers to identify contestants must be worn on both the front and back of each contestant's shirt so as to be perfectly visible to opponents, officials, and spectators at all times during the race.

RESULTS OF THE MEET—The complete results of the meet will be posted on a large scoreboard in the Jenison Field House, immediately after the run.

PRIZES—Trophies will be awarded to first and second place teams. Individual medals will be awarded the first fifteen men to finish. The first five members of the first, second, and third place teams also shall receive medals. Prizes will be distributed from the score board in Jenison Field House.

PUBLIC ADDRESS SYSTEM—The Public Address System is operated through the courtesy of the Michigan State College Radio Station, WKAR. Positions of the runners at points along the course, and as they finish, will be given over the Public Address System by the Announcer, Prof. Charles McCaffree, Jr.

RESULTS OF PREVIOUS NATIONAL COLLEGIATE CROSS COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIPS

Since inception of the National Collegiate Cross Country Championships in 1938, the meet has been held each year over the Michigan State College Four Mile Cross Country course in East Lansing. The meet was not held in 1943. Results of the meets held since the N.C.A.A. Cross Country Championships began in 1938 are listed below:

First Annual Meet: November 28, 1938. Individual Winner: Greg Rice, Notre Dame '39, in 20:12.9. Team Champion: Indiana.

Second Annual Meet: November 20, 1939. Individual Winner: Walter J. Mehl, Wisconsin '40, in 20:30.9. Team Champion: Michigan State.

Third Annual Meet: November 25, 1940. Individual Winner: Gilbert Dodds, Ashland '41, in 20:30.2. Team Champion: Indiana.

Fourth Annual Meet: November 24, 1941. Individual Winner: Frederick L. Wilt, Indiana '43, in 20:32.1. Team Champion: Rhode Island State.

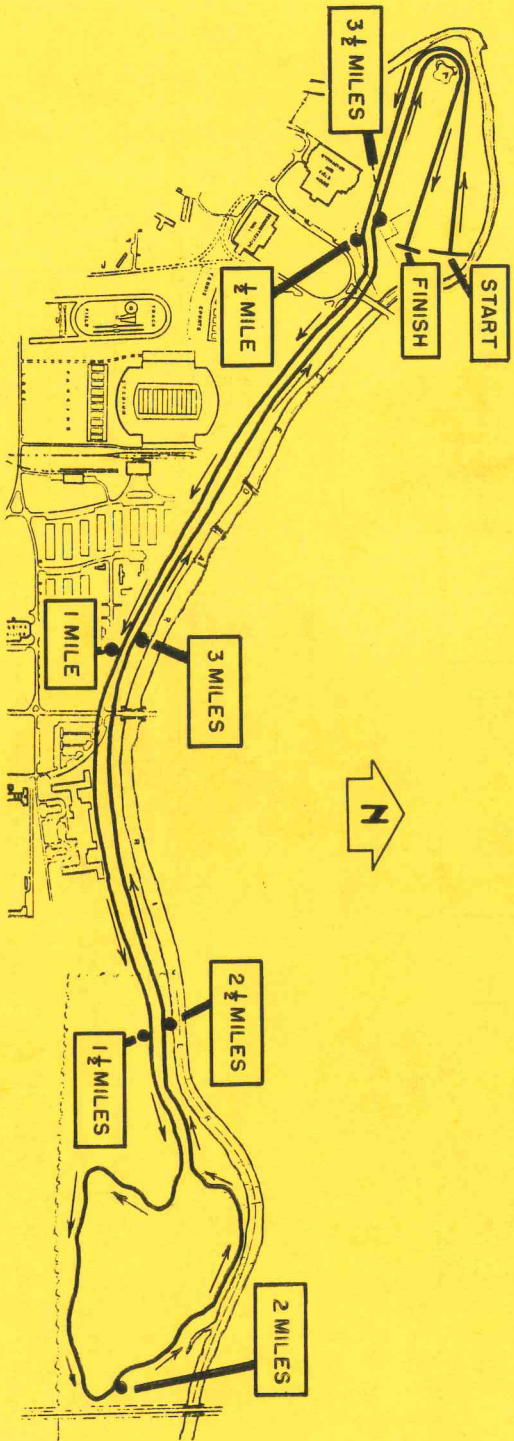

TEAM SCORING: N.C.A.A. rules on scoring Cross Country runs will be followed. To get team scores, all runners on teams that didn't finish at least five men are checked off. Low score wins. Points are counted against all the rest in the order they finished in the race. For example, 1 point is counted against the team of the runner who finishes first on this list and 12 points count against the team of the runner who finishes twelfth. A team's score is the total of the points counted against the first five of its runners.

THE COURSE—Starting on the practice field by the baseball diamond, the course takes a long loop around the entire playing area and then leads east past Macklin Field, along the river and across Farm Lane to the college sugar bush. After following the main service road on a broad loop through the sugar bush for almost a full mile, the course returns by the same route to the original starting area, finishing in front of the permanent bleachers at the baseball diamond. Length of course: 4 miles.
