Notice to Competitors

Each Competitor must obtain his number cards at least 45 minutes before his event. These cards are to be worn throughout the competition on both back and chest.

Each race will be started punctually at the time stated in the programme. The Championships Committee reserves the right of making any alteration in the programme that may be deemed necessary.

Field Events Equipment.—The Association will provide Equipment for all Field Events. A competitor may use his own POLE subject to permission being given by the Referee.

Track athletes are informed that warming up will not be permitted on the arena. Facilities have been provided in the White City car park—entrance by main score board.

Accommodation in "B" Stand will be specially reserved for competitors, who will be allowed in the centre of the ground only immediately prior to competing. Track Event Competitors will be allowed on to the arena 10 minutes before their event and Field Event Competitors 20 minutes before their event. Competitors for 100 yards, 220 yards, 120 yards hurdles, Hammer, Discus and Javelin will assemble in the paddock (main score board end). For all other events competitors will assemble in the competitors bay by the dressing room tunnel.

COMPETITORS MUST LEAVE THE ARENA IMMEDIATELY AFTER THEIR EVENT HAS TAKEN PLACE.

Competitors gaining A.A.A. Standard and requiring the A.A.A. Standard Certificate should report to the Competitors' Steward.

THE "HARVEY" MEMORIAL GOLD CUP

To be awarded to the Competitor who is adjudged by the Championships Committee to have accomplished the best performance or performances at the A.A.A. Championships.

THE PEPSI-COLA AWARD

To be awarded to the United Kingdom athlete, under the age of twenty-one, who is adjudged to have accomplished the best performance or performances at the A.A.A. Championships.

Asterisks appear in the programme against the names of all competitors who are under "twenty-one".

THE "C. N. JACKSON" MEMORIAL CUP

To be awarded to the competitor born in the United Kingdom, who is adjudged by the Championships Committee to be the outstanding athlete of the year.

Note.—The year is the Calendar year, and the award is open to athletes in cross-country, track, road walking and field events.

THE "JOHN THORNTON" MEMORIAL TROPHY

To be awarded for the best performance in the HIGH HURDLES during the year in the United Kingdom, as adjudged by the Championships Committee.

THE CARBORUNDUM GOLDEN JUBILEE TROPHY

To be awarded to the United Kingdom competitor who is adjudged by the Championships Committee to have accomplished the best Track Event performance at the A.A.A. Championships.

THE "W. J. PEPPER" MEMORIAL TROPHY

To be awarded to the United Kingdom competitor who is adjudged by the Championships Committee to have accomplished the best Field Event performance at the A.A.A. Championships.

THE "FOWLER DIXON" MEDAL

for style will be awarded in both the two and seven miles Walking Championships at the discretion of the Judges. To qualify, a competitor must complete the distance within the Standard Time.

CHAMPIONSHIP INDIVIDUAL AWARDS

FIRST IN EACH EVENT.—The Association Silver Gilt Plaque.

SECOND IN EACH EVENT.—The Association Silver Plaque.

THIRD IN EACH EVENT.—The Association Bronze Plaque.

THE A.A.A. STANDARDS SCHEME will operate at this meeting.

SPECIAL PLAQUES will be awarded to competitors equalling or bettering any A.A.A. National Record.

TEAM AWARDS

TUG-OF-WAR.—A Silver Gilt Medal will be awarded to the coach and each member of the winning team, and to the runners-up when four or more teams compete.

RELAYS.—A Silver Gilt Medal to each member of the winning team. A Silver Medal to each member of the second team if four or more teams compete. A Bronze Medal to each member of the third team when eight or more teams compete.
