WESTERN CONFERENCE TRACK COACHES



BOB WRIGHT, a veteran of 29 years of high school coaching, succeeded the highly successful Leo Johnson, who retired after 29 years at the Illini helm in June, 1965. In 19 seasons at Oak Park-River Forest High his teams won one state title, two seconds, three thirds, a fourth and two fifths. A 1936 graduate of Illinois, Wright was a football and track letterman, playing end and halfback and running the hurdles and relays. He has two sons, Jim, a graduate student at Illinois, and John, an outstanding end on the Illini football team last season and a fine hurdler in track.



ROY GRIAK, a 1949 Minnesota graduate who lettered in both track and cross-country, is in his fourth season as Gopher head coach. Before returning to Minnesota in 1963, his St. Louis Park High School squads won three state championships. His 1965 Minnesota team produced a pair of champions in shotputter Tom Barnes and two-miler Norris Peterson, the latter leading a rare 1-2-3 sweep for the Gophers. Griak's 1964 cross country squad brought Minnesota its first Big Ten championship in 50 years, and his 1963 and 1965 teams placed third.



JIM LAVERY, 37-year-old Indiana head coach of track and cross-country, is in his sixth season in that capacity after serving as assistant from 1952. A native of Calgary, Canada, Jim twice captained Drake teams and won a place as one of Drake's all-time track greats. He ran in the 1952 Olympics on the Canadian team, making the semi-finals of the 400-meter and running on the fourth place 1600-meter relay team. He holds both Master's and Doctorate degrees from Indiana University.



BOB EHRHART, a native of Naperville and Wildcat head coach since 1960, has produced some great distance runners, although he won Big Ten titles as a vaulter at Northwestern in 1953 and 1954. His 1965 cross-country team won Northwestern its first Big Ten title and placed second in the NCAA, while two of his runners, Lee Assenheimer and Craig Boydston last year broke every school record for the mile and two mile. As an undergraduate Bob held the Thomas Coyne scholarship for academic and athletic achievement and was named Northwestern's "Athlete of the year" in 1954.



FRANCIS X. CRETZMEYER, University of Iowa track coach since 1948, is in his 19th year at the post. In the mid-30s he starred as an all-around track and field athlete at Iowa and still holds the scoring record for one season—144 1/4 points. He had his greatest coaching year in 1963 when his team shared the Big Ten indoor title and won the outdoor crown. His Hawkeyes broke three conference records, both indoor and outdoor. Iowans have won 94 titles in major meets. One team member was twice an Olympian and another made one Olympic team.



BOB EPSKAMP, for five years head coach at Miami University, was named Ohio State track coach in 1965 to succeed retired Larry Snyder. A 1952 graduate of Western Michigan, Epskamp, after Navy service, coached at Monroe (Michigan) High School and as assistant at Western Michigan before going to Miami in 1961. He developed strong teams at Miami and such individuals as Bob Shul, the 1964 Olympic 5000-meter champion, who was a world and American record holder.



DON CANHAM has been head track coach at the University of Michigan for 18 years, a period in which he has established himself as one of the nation's most successful coaches. In the last twelve years his teams have won ten Big Ten championships and tied for another. Twelve teams have been runners-up and his athletes have set more than 80 indoor-outdoor records. A native of Oak Park, Illinois, Canham captained the 1941 Michigan team and during his competitive career was NCAA high jump champion and four times Big Ten titlist. Author of five books on track, he has made six foreign coaching trips and is Executive Vice President of the National Collegiate Track Coaches Association.



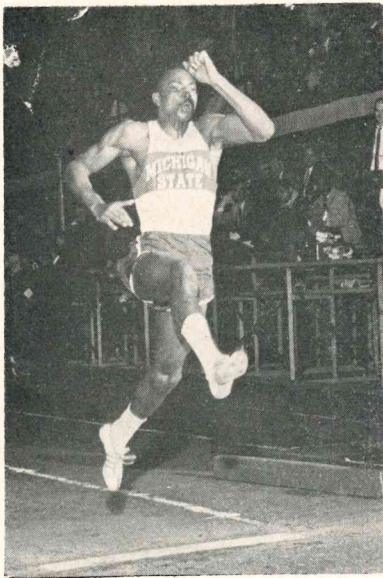
DAVE RANKIN has been Purdue's head track coach for 20 years, during which time he has developed many outstanding athletes. At Purdue Rankin was one of the school's most versatile athletes, football captain and All-American end, record-setting hurdler and All-American trackman. A 1939 and 1940 All-American, Rankin was named to the 1965 Sports Illustrated Silver Anniversary All-American football team. In track he was co-holder of the world record in 60-yard indoor low hurdles. He became a Marine fighter pilot in 1941 and flew 150 missions in the South Pacific, winning four air medals.



FRANCIS C. DITTRICH is in his ninth season as Michigan State head coach and his squad last year won the Big Ten indoor and outdoor championships. A three letter man in track and captain of the 1936 MSU team, Dittrich served 20 years as assistant to Karl Schlademan before succeeding him in 1958. His cross-country teams have won five Big Ten, three IC4A and two NCAA championships. Fifteen of his athletes have captured a total of 23 Big Ten titles and one NCAA indoor crown. During World War II he captained an LCI in the Pacific.



CHARLES (RUT) WALTER is in his seventh year at Wisconsin, a period during which the Badgers won the indoor championship in 1962 and 1965 and the outdoor crown in 1964. At Northwestern, his alma mater, he won the Big Ten 440 title in 1928-1929-1930, the NCAA 440 in 1929, and ran anchor on the mile relay. He was on the Northwestern staff for 30 years, from 1952 to 1960 as head track coach. Walter was all-state in both basketball and track at Kokomo (Indiana) High School, winning three events in the state meet. In 1964 he was assistant coach of the U.S. Olympic team.
