Maggard Organizes Finest Athens Field

When Dave Maggard became head track coach at Cal last year, he also inherited the job of Meet Director for the Athens Invitational.

Whereas winter used to be between seasons for Maggard, now it's like mid-season in his office on the Berkeley campus.

"We were determined to make this meet a success and keep Athens Sports, Inc., alive last year," the burly Cal coach said. "But there were five other indoor meets scheduled on that weekend and we had some trouble getting top athletes."

Ron Clarke, who had set a world indoor record the year before in Oakland, came back, and the meet managed to make a small amount of revenue for the Athens Track and Field team for the first time.

"This year we decided to pull out all stops," Maggard said. "We planned to expand the meet and hoped to draw more of an audience."

The meet was expanded to include the Northern California Indoor championships for high schools and junior colleges. "We felt it would be good for the local high schools and JCs to get something like this going. It would help them build interest," he said.

Maggard also added a pentathlon, giving all around athletes a chance to excel in more than one event.

Certainly, Maggard has had a lot of success assembling the Athens' best-ever open field, but he has been trying to late this week to add one or two more big names.

"The name that helped put 13,000 people in the Cow Palace earlier this year was Jim Ryun," he said. "I talked to Jim after that meet and he said he might want to run at Athens depending on how he feels."

Ryun traveled by car from the Bay Area to Kansas to pick up his belongings and moved by car and trailer to Oregon, where he has a job on a newspaper. And meanwhile, Maggard nervously waited in Berkeley to hear how Ryun's first workouts went in Oregon.

There were others Maggard sweated out in his usual calm manner. He felt Steve Prefontaine was ready for a great race, but he didn't want to pressure him. He talked a few times to Bill Dellinger in Oregon, and Prefontaine's announcement came as a triumph for Maggard.

Another personnel triumph for the former Olympic shot putter is the dual between outdoor world record holder Randy Matson and indoor world record holder Al Feuerbach. In their last Bay Area meeting, Feuerbach set the world indoor standard, and the rematch is interesting. Matson, a good friend of Maggard's, got off the world's second best-ever toss, over 71-feet, the last time he came

to a meet run by Maggard—last year's Kennedy Games at Cal.

The Russians, however, are the core of the meet. They are some of the world's top ranked competitors, and Maggard is thrilled to have them.

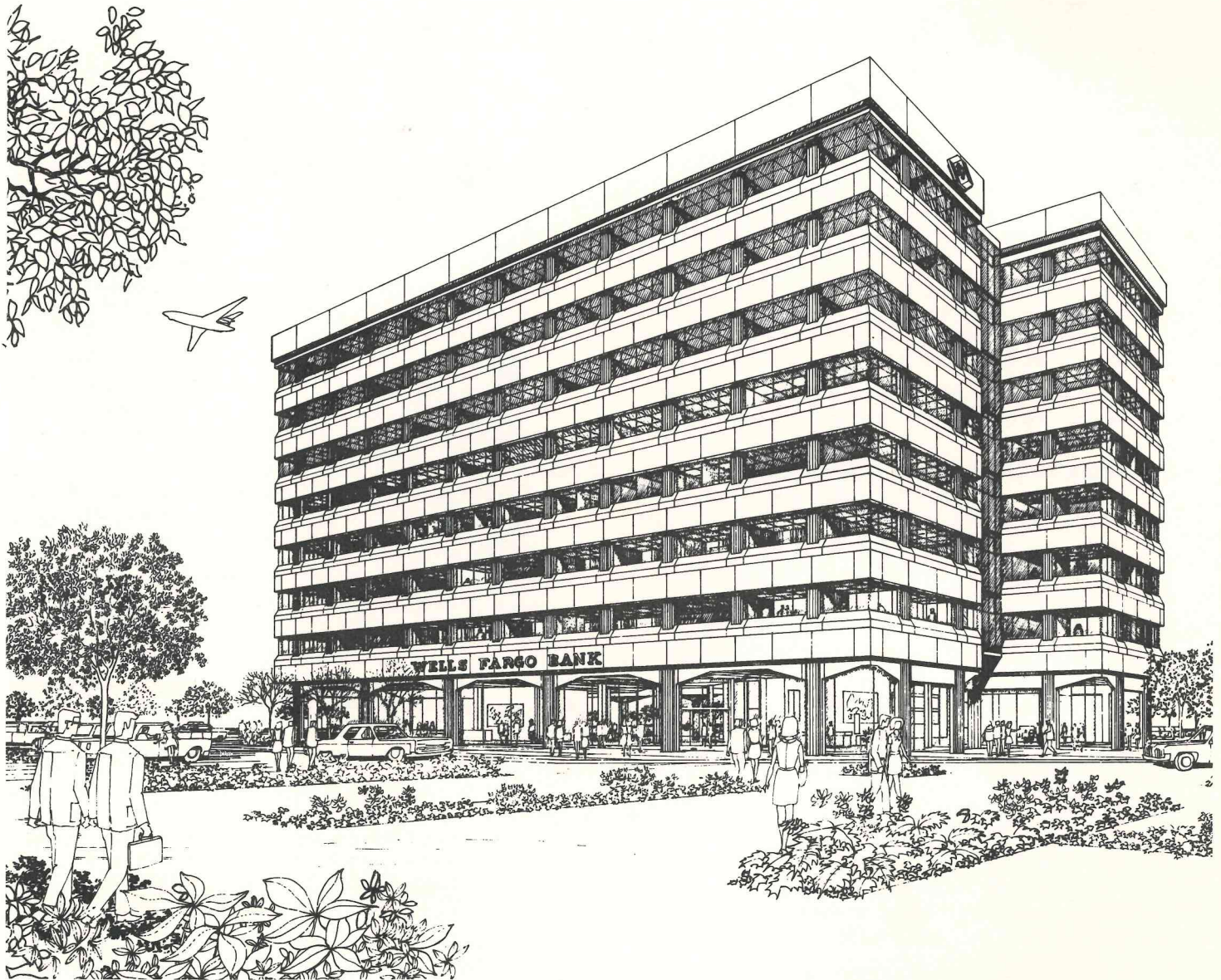
"I was in Russia in 1965 and 1968, and I know it was a great experience for me," Maggard said. "They are very interested in track over there and they are the masters of technique. Why even now they have a back-flopping high jumper who has the second-best back-flop ever. (He is in the meet, by the way.)"

The world record holders, former and present, and Olympic champions are great pluses for the meet—Lee Evans in the 500, Viktor Saneyev in the triple jump, Ralph Boston in the long jump, Ralph Doubell of Australia in the 1000. And there are great races—the 1,000-yard run and the two-mile, in which records are endangered.

Maggard will also be keeping a close eye on his Cal contingent in the meet. Above it all, he is the head coach at Cal.

Russians Eye '72 Olympics

The Russian team competing in tonight's Athens Invitational was born two years ago in the oxygen-poor atmosphere of Mexico City. It was born out of necessity and mothered with pride.

The Russians did not do well in the 1968 Olympics. Certainly, they won three gold medals: in the 20,000 meter walk, the triple jump and the javelin.

They had, of course, expected more and judging from the team in this meet tonight they have reason to look forward to Munich and 1972.

Historically, the Russians have accepted a challenge. The tragedy of Mexico City was no different.

"There is no doubt the Russians are sending us many of the best athletes they have," said Dave Maggard, the University of California coach who is director of this meet. Maggard, a competitor in the shot put in Mexico City, has made two trips to Russia.

"Indoor track has just recently become very important to the Russians. I think they are concerned about doing well on this tour. I'd be surprised if any of their athletes were not in real good shape."

Who are the Russians on this team?

"I don't think many people realize how really good this group is," said Maggard.

Of the six men on the team, three are currently ranked No. 1 in the world by Track and Field News in their respective events: Viktor Saneyev (the Olympic champion) in the triple jump, Yergeny Arzhanov in the 800 meters and Valeriy Borzov, the sprinter who defeated the Americans last year in Leningrad.

Borzov, whose 10.10 100 meter ranked as the best in 1969, was placed No. 2 in the 1970 rankings behind John Carlos, since retired.

Twenty-one year old Kestutis Sapka is typical of the Russian team: young, talented and aware of new methods. Sapka is a back flopping high jumper, a user of the style made famous by America's Dick Fosbury.

Sapka, typically, now ranks as the world's No. 1 flopper and his 7'3 $\frac{1}{4}$ " jump is second only to Fosbury's 7'4 $\frac{1}{4}$ " jump in Mexico City on the all-time list.

Distance runners Michael Jelobovsky, with a best of 3:40.5 in the 1,500 meters, and Rashid Sharafyedinov, the No. 4 ranked 5,000 meter runner in the world in 1969, complete the men's group.

The last Russian team to visit the Bay Area came to the Oakland Arena in 1968 for the National AAU Indoor championships. That time, the hit of the Soviet team was pretty blonde Tatiana Talishiva, a bouncy long jumper and hurdler.

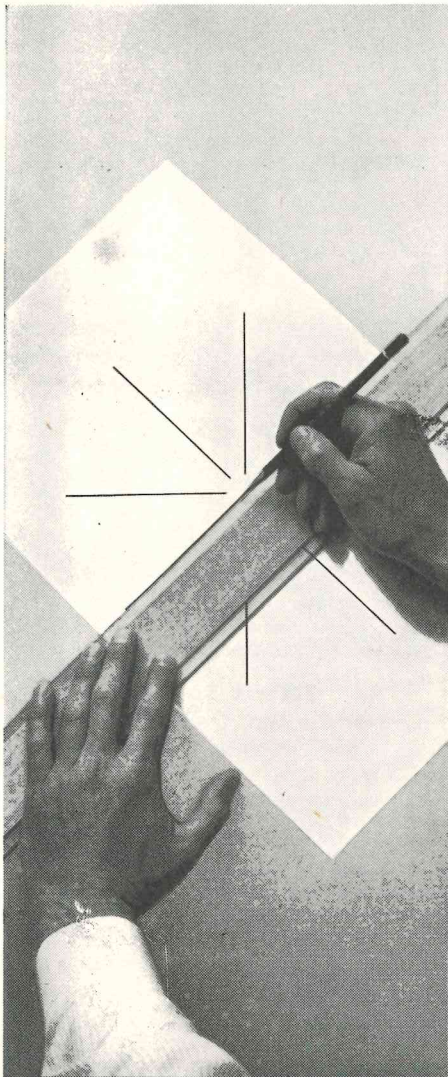
For tonight's meet, the Russians have entered three women: Tatiana Kondrashova, 21, 13.3 100-meter, hurdler; Nadejda Kolesnikova, 23, with best times of 43.8 at 400 meters and 2:04.1 at 80; and Ludmila Bragina, 27, who has run a 4:13.4 for the 1,500 meters.

There has always been a warm relationship between Russian track athletes and the Bay Area. It began with the tremendously successful U.S.-U.S.S.R. dual meet at Stanford in 1962—perhaps the best meet of its kind ever held—and tonight's meet adds yet another chapter.

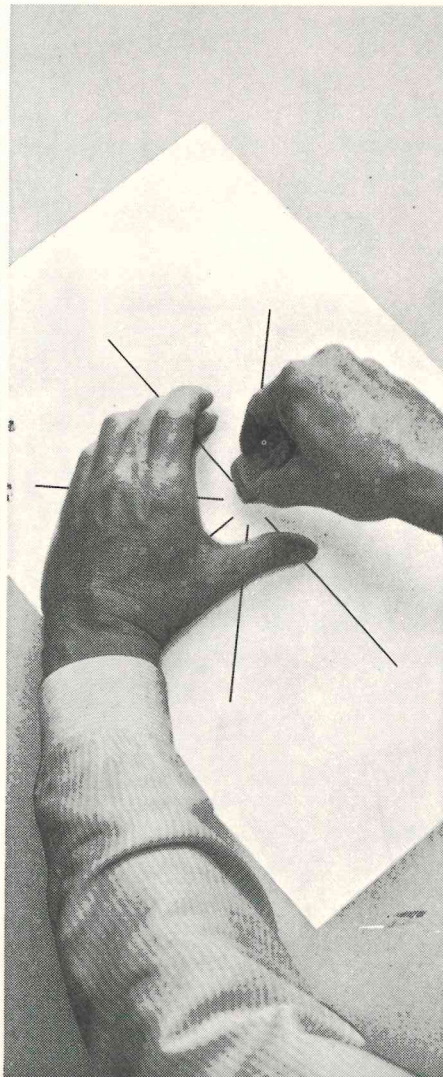

It didn't take the Russians long to find out what's happening in America.

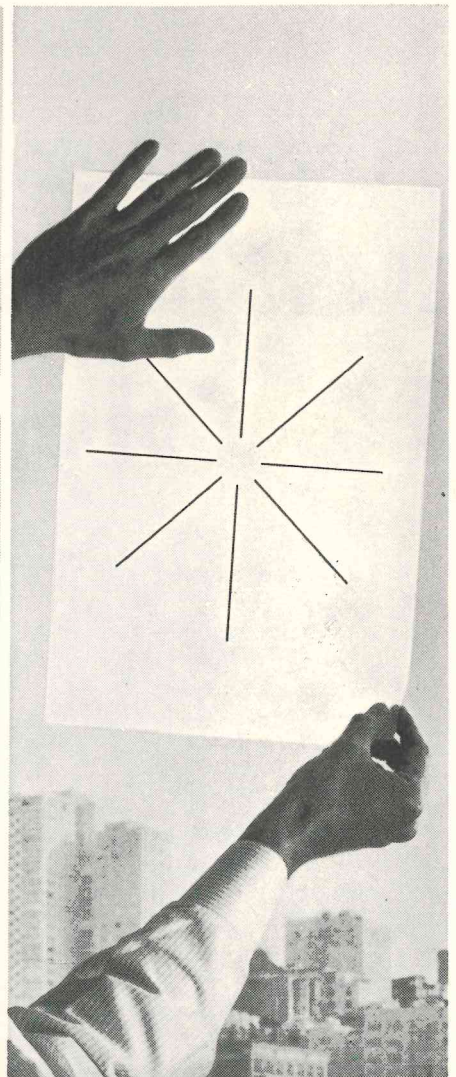
