Valeriy The Great

The New King: Valeriy Borzov breezes to victory.



Who's the greatest sprinter that ever lived? Was it Jesse Owens, the Ohio State phenom who broke three world records and tied another in a single day at Ann Arbor and won four gold medals at Berlin in 1936?

Was it Bob Hayes, the Florida A&M flash who ran the first 9.1 in the 100-yard dash, the first 5.9 in the 60-yard dash and won the 400-meter relay for the United States at Tokyo with a come-from-behind anchor that was unofficially clocked in an incredible 8.6?

How about Bobby Morrow, the Abilene Christian flyer who won three gold medals at Melbourne in 1956? Or Pell-Mel Patton who set world records in both the 100 and 220?

How good were Ralph Metcalfe and John Carlos whose best years came between Olympic Games? Could any man who ever lived beat Tommie Smith at 200 meters? Couldn't you make a case for Jimmie Hines?

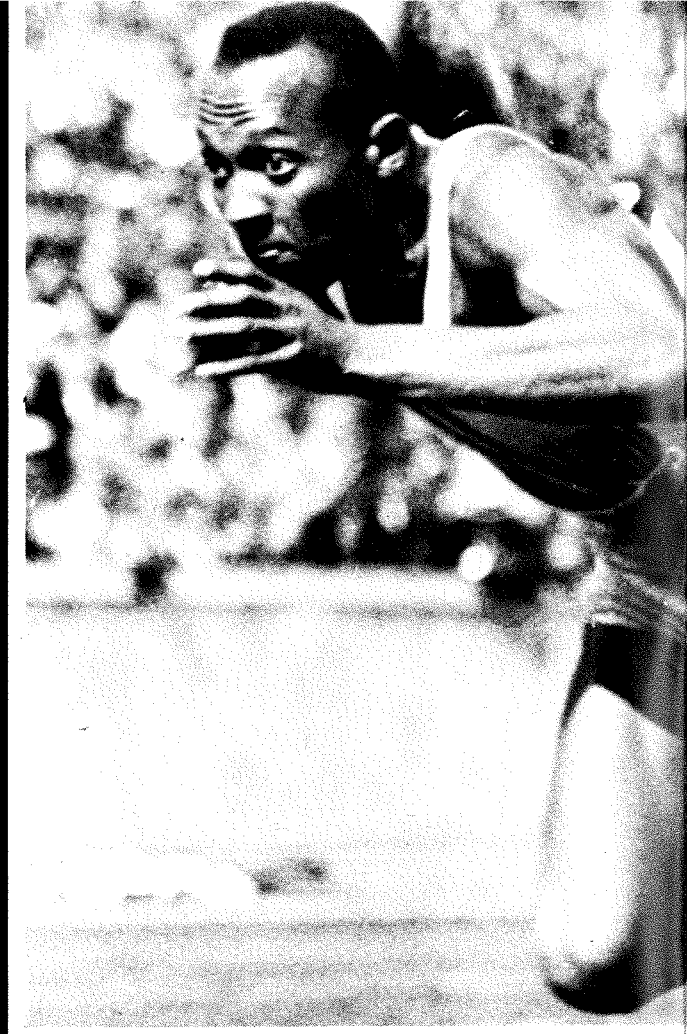
Remember Hal Davis, the California Comet? A lot of people don't but he never lost a 220 in four years and would have won any number of medals if World War II hadn't wiped out the Olympics of 1940 and 1944.

And let's not forget the original world's fastest human, Charley Paddock, an honest-to-goodness flyer whose leaping finishes became a trademark.

Finally, let's not forget the current world's fastest human, Valeriy Borzov.

Does Borzov belong?

Well, if winning counts for anything, it's tough to keep him off the ballot. He beat 'em all laughing at Munich and he hasn't lost a big race since the 1970 Soviet championships.

That year he beat America's best in the USA-Russia dual meet, then repeated in 1971 at Berkeley with an even more decisive triumph.

He has no weaknesses. He starts with the best of them and he finishes with a flourish. So easily did he win the 100 and 200 meters at Munich that both times he raised his arms in triumph before crossing the finish line.

He's got strength, he's got style. He even has good looks. He looks like a winner.

He stands 5-11½ and weighs 175. He's got legs that would look good on a college halfback. He's heavier than most sprinters but it's all power, the result of endless hours of weightlifting under a scientifically-controlled training program.

Stamina? One of his favorite workouts is running 800 meters. How many American sprinters do you know who would do that?

Yes, he's got it all. He could be the best the world has ever seen, but how are you going to prove it?

He has yet to set a world record and he has yet to beat a great American sprinter. John Carlos was clearly our best in 1970 but he injured himself in the National AAU and didn't make the trip to Russia.

The field in the Munich 100 was one of the weakest ever. Eddie Hart and Rey Robinson were missing, after arriving late for the preliminaries, and Jean-Louis Ravelomanantsoa was injured. Lennox Miller wasn't near the sprinter he was at Mexico City.

You remember Morrow for his victories over people like Dave Sime, Ray Norton and Leamon King. Patton had to turn back the likes of Lloyd LaBeach, Andy Stanfield and Barney Ewell. Hines had to beat Charlie Greene. Owens had to beat Metcalfe.



All of them set or equaled world records. Where does that leave Borzov? He's now 23 years old. He races sparingly. He says he's not interested in records, only victories. He eased up in the 200 meters at Munich and still ran 20 flat, a time nobody has bettered in a non-altitude race.

Is it his fault we have nobody to challenge him? Wasn't Metcalfe really over the hill when Owens beat him? Can you name anybody else Owens beat?

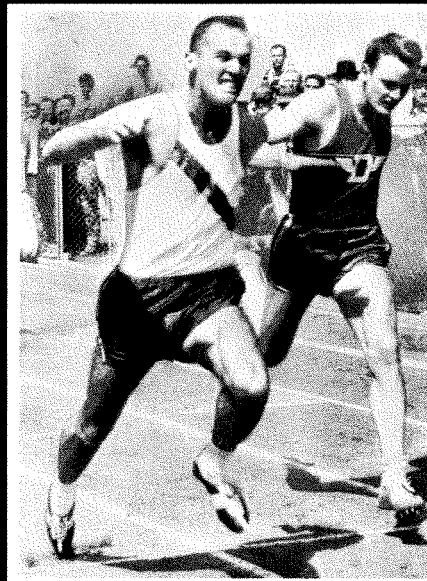
For that matter, who did Bob Hayes beat?

Let's just say that Mr. Borzov is one helluva sprinter, and when he's introduced for the first time in Los Angeles tonight in the Times Indoor Games, how about a salute to a real champion.

He's something.
