

HIGH SCHOOL TRACK SEASON APPROACHES

With the State Basketball Tournaments barely over, the M-SHS trackmen already have one indoor meet under their belts. The Charleston Invitational was held March 24, and was won by Tuscola. The Bulldogs' seven points came from the following participants: Galen Dale who claimed first in the high jump with a leap of 6', Doug Williams placed fifth in the pole vault going 12', and Steve Saylor's 54.2 clocking earned him a sixth place finish in the 440 yard dash. The mile relay team was timed in 3:49.0, but failed to place. Again this Saturday M-S is entered in another indoor meet, this one being held at the Armory, on campus and beginning at 10:00 A.M. The outdoor season is scheduled to begin Tuesday, April 3rd, with M-S hosting Fisher and Saybrook-Arrowsmith.

TRACKMEN DROP HOME OPENER

Opening under the less than ideal conditions of cold, damp weather, the M-S track team was outscored by Fairbury-Cropsey 80-67½ in a triangular meet held here April 3. Both teams easily outpointed Fisher, which scored 19½ points.

Although Steve Saylor and Galen Dale were triple winners, M-S failed to place in the shot put, pole vault and 2 mile, thus hurting the over-all team depth.

Saylor was a winner in the sprints, with times of 11.0 in the 100 yard dash, 24.9 in the 220, and 55.2 in the 440. Dale recorded first place finishes in the high jump, clearing 5'10" and led the sweep in the long jump, with a leap of 17'2 3/4". He also was on the victorious 880 yard relay team which recorded a 1:41.0 clocking. Mark Nichols, Bob Scott, and Kent Leonard were other members of this team.

The only other individual winner was Nichols in the low hurdles, with a time of 23.1.

Four Bulldogs earned second place finishes. They were Bob Bantz, 880, with a 2:11.9 time, Bob Scott, long jump, 17'0 3/4", mile relay team of Dale, Scott, Brian Anderson and Tim Lindsey with a 3:54 clocking and the Freshman-Sophomore 880 yard relay team of Mark Kesler, Steve Karr, Jeff Clinebell and Craig Nichols. Their time was 1:54.3.

M-S used strong depth to defeat the Hornets, as the Bulldogs placed in every event but the shot put.

Galen Dale and Steve Saylor were double winners, Dale clearing 6'0" for victory in the high jump, and claiming the long jump with an effort of 18'4 3/4". Saylor won the 440 in a time of 55.2 and tied Heyworth's Bob Dewey in the 100 yard dash. Each were clocked at 10.6.

Single winners included Jack Eichelberger, discus (102'3"), Bill James, two mile (11:07), Bob Bantz, 880 (2:13.5), Mark Nichols, 180 yard low hurdles (23.1) and Jeff Howard, mile run, (5:06).

The Bulldogs tuned up for the Normal relays by garnering 13 firsts and 11 seconds on route to a resounding victory over DeLand-Weldon and Urbana Uni High, on April 23rd. The final scoring found M-S on top with 125 and D-W edging Uni for second, 28-20.

Taking individual honors were Steve Saylor who won the 100 yard dash (10.5), the 220 yard dash (24.7), and the 440 yard dash (54.9). Kent Leonard took first in the hurdles, winning the lows in 22.1 and the highs in 17.8. Leonard also combined with Bob Scott, Mark Nichols and Brian Anderson to win the mile relay in 4:02.3. Galen Dale won the high jump with a 6-foot effort and the long jump, 18' 3/4". Dale also claimed second in the 100 (10.8) and the 440 (55.1).

TOLONO — Unity's Rockets, beating off a strong bid by Mahomet-Seymour's gritty Bulldogs, remained Champaign county prep track champions in a fast-paced meet, the 54th of the venerable series, here Friday night.

Unity outpointed its challenger, whose breakthrough in 1971 was the only interruption of Rocket rule in the last seven years, 72 points to 66. With just three events to go, Mahomet-Seymour led, 59-52.

But a missed exchange in the freshman-sophomore relay, the next-to-next-to-last event, doomed the Bulldogs. While they failed to score, Unity's soph Dick

Miller, Jan Meyer, Jeff Ishcomer, and Mark Meharry claimed the race for Unity. Mahomet-Seymour's lead was down to 59-58.

Unity dash star Jay Miller and his shadow, Andy Ennis, then scored their 1-2 finish in the 100-yard dash by placing similarly in the 220 to clinch the title for Joe Summerville's host squad. While Mahomet-Seymour outran Unity in the meet-capping mile relay, those 10 points in the 220 assured the Rockets their second straight county trophy, their sixth in seven seasons under Summerville, and their 12th in 24 years as a consolidated school.

Miller's double dash triumph—he repeated as cham-

ption in both events—the frosh-soph 880 relay win, and one by Andy Ennis, Kent Carrell, Joni Khachatourian, and Miller in the varsity 880 relay were the only competitions topped by Unity in the 16-event program.

Frank Dutton's M-S Bulldogs, meanwhile, claimed five first places. Bob Bantz repeated as 880 champ and Galen Dale duplicated his high jump win of last year. Doug Williams emerged with pole vault honors and a new record, one he'll share with Rich Davis of ABL, for they both cleared 12 feet 8 3/4 inches. Williams rated the win because he made that height on his first try while Davis needed a second run at it.

Dale Bantz, and Williams teamed with soph Brian Anderson to put the mile relay in Mahomet-Seymour's column, and they clipped 1/10 second off St. Joseph-Ogden's four-year-old record with a 3:40.3 clocking.

Miller was just one of three two-event winners in the meet. One was Homer's illustrious Bill Edwards, whose beefing up since the basketball season helped him loft the shot for a record 56 feet 3/4 inch, shattering the nine-year-old mark of ABL's Don Snyder, and then adding a 163-foot-2-inch discus fling, less than two feet shy of his own county record.

The other was Mike Brehm, Fisher's tireless distance runner. He began the evening by slashing the two-mile record he held jointly with former Uni High runner Tod Satterthwaite from 10:08.4 to 9:48.7, and he came back later to turn the mile in a springy 4:36.2, just 4/10 seconds off a 14-year-old county mark.

Outscoring both Homer and Fisher, however, were St. Jo-

seph-Ogden and ABL, third and fourth in the meet with 43 and 32 points respectively. SJO had two winners: Gary Bensyl in the high hurdles and Pete Marsh in the 440. ABL had one in rugged Stan Wienke, who won the long jump and pushed Homer's Edwards in both weight throws — he also beat the old record in the shot with a 54.6 heave.

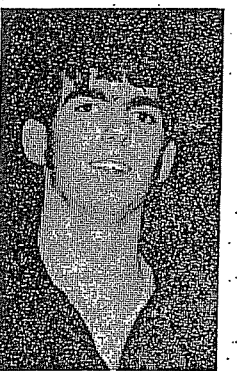
Mahomet-Seymour made its strong showing despite the absence of Steve Savier, winner of the 440 last year; he pulled a muscle Tuesday and was withheld from competition.

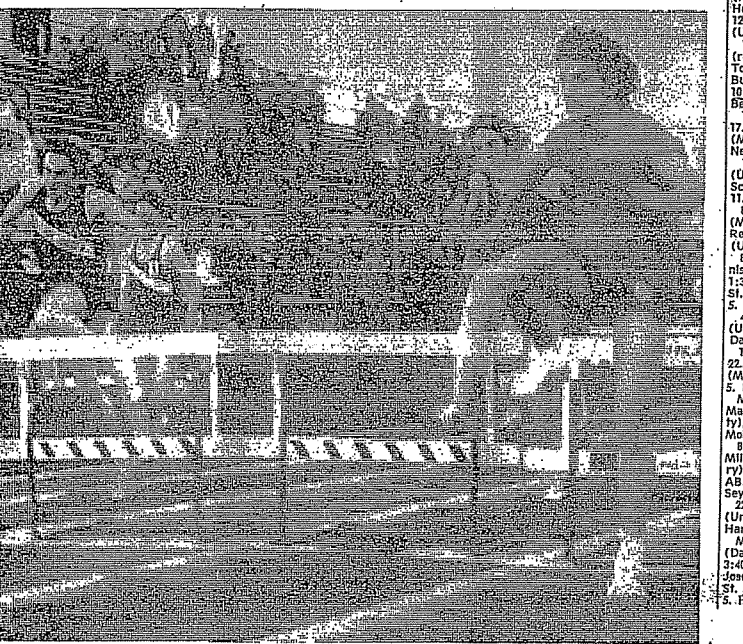
Eric Mast, finishing second to Brehm in the mile, also provided Uni High with four points.

Tuscola Solid Victor In Unity Meet

TOLONO—Despite being minus two of its first-line performers, Tuscola claimed the championship of Unity High School's third annual Invitational Track and Field Meet here Friday night with a solid total of 75 points.

Mahomet-Seymour, also without one of its better runners, continued in its bridesmaid role, finishing second in a major meet for the third time in eight days. The Bulldogs shaded Unity's host Rockets, who won last year, for the runner-up position by a 56-54 count. Mahomet-Seymour ran second to Unity in the Champaign County meet here a week ago, and was second to Argenta-Oreana in the Sangamon Valley Conference meet last Tuesday.

Steadily improving St. Joseph-Ogden surged past Monticello and ABL with a closing rush to earn fourth place, 38 to 31 to 28 respectively.

Gene Murray's Tuscola troupe won seven of the 20 events on the program, including three relays. Individual leader of the Warriors was Gary French, one of three two-event winners in the meet, and he set new records in both, copping the varsity long jump with a leap of 21 feet 7 1/2 inches and turning the 440-yard dash in 51.2 seconds.

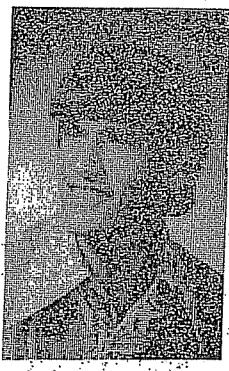
Randy Todd, Rick Smith, Steve Mick, and Steve Owen combined for a 45.7 timing in

Mick, moreover, repeated as half-mile champion, missing his own record by one-tenth second with a 2:03.2 clocking. Rudy Huber ruled the high hurdles and Jeff Brinkley, Jim Crowder, Lee Brian, and Vince Galey won the freshman 440 relay.

The missing Warrior stars were hurdler-dashman Rob Meyer, lost with a dislocated knee, and sprinter Ric Izquierdo, pursuing a pulled muscle.

Mahomet-Seymour's absentee was Steve Saylor, 440 reliable. As it was, the Bulldogs got a record high jump of 6 feet 3/4 inch from Galen Dale, a frosh-

soph long jump win from soph Brian Anderson, a low hurdles victory from Mark Nichols, and a first place from Dale, with Leonard, Bob Scott, and Nichols in the 880 relay.

Unity's Jay Miller was a double winner in the dashes, and right behind him in both races was Andy Ennis. Jan Meyer won the frosh-soph 100-yard dash. The Rockets probably would have wound up second in the meet had they not blown their 880 relay bid with a bad exchange.

"We would have won that relay," wined Unity coach Joe Summerville. "Not only that, we were on our way to a meet record."

With Homer's injured Bill Edwards watching from the sidelines, Stan-Wienke of ABL was in a class by himself in the

weight tosses. He broke the meet shot put record he set last year by almost 1 1/2 feet with a 53-6 heave, and won the discus with a throw of 156 feet, almost 20 feet more than his nearest rival. With a third place in the long jump, Wienke totaled 15 points.

Trojan teammate Rich Davis shattered his meet pole vault mark with a clearance of 13 feet 7 1/2 inches, more than a foot over last year's mark.

Ray Berning racked up 6 points for Paxton by winning the two-mile run. Carl Cox put the mile run in Oakwood's column. And Tony Johnson gave St. Joseph-Ogden a first in the frosh-soph 880.

In-County Track Meet

The 54th annual Champaign County Track meet was staged Friday (4th) at Unity. As has been the custom in recent years, the Bulldogs battled host Unity for the crown, which the Rockets claimed for the sixth time in seven years. Team scorers were: Unity—72, Mahomet—66, St. Joe—Ogden—43, A.B.L.—32, Homer—20, Fisher—17, and Urbana Uni High—5.

Two of the five M-S winners set new meet records. Doug Williams had a hand in both of them, clearing 12'8" in the pole vault and raced the final leg in the mile relay. The relay team of Galen Dale, Bob Bantz, Brian Anderson, and Williams were victorious in a time of 3:40.3. Other individual winners were Dale, high jump, 5'11", Bantz, 880 yard dash, 2:06.4 and Mark Nichols 180 yard low hurdles, 22.5.

Dale barely missed winning the long jump with his leap of 20'3". The winning effort was 20'4", placing Dale in second. Jeff Howard also got a second, in the 880 yard dash. The 880 yard relay team also got a runner-up ribbon.

Although he only placed third, Bill James time in the two mile, 10:37, was only :4 off the school record. His effort also broke the Bulldog Fresh-Soph record, which was set two years ago by Andy Chaney. Kent Leonard got two of the other four third place ribbons, in the high and low hurdles. Anderson in the 440 and Williams in the high were the others.

Claiming fourth were Dale, 440 yard dash, James, mile run, and Bob Scott, 100 yard dash.

Placing fifth were Scott, 220 yard dash, Anderson, long jump, and Tim Lindsey, discus.

The evening before the County meet, on May 3rd, M-S toppled LeRoy in a dual meet. Final score was M-S—92 5/6, LeRoy 50 1/6.

Tim Lindsey, shotput (37 3/4") and discus (116'1") and Galen Dale, 100 yard dash (10.5), and long jump (19'3") were the double winners for M-S. Other Bulldogs recording first place efforts were: Art Farley, high jump (5'2"), Doug Williams, pole vault (12'6"), Bill James, 2 mile, (10:55.4) and Mark Nichols, 180 yard low hurdles (23.0), Brian Anderson and Bob Bantz tied at 56.4 in the 440 yard dash. Three relays units claimed victory. The mile relay squad of Tyrone Dalton, Bantz, Williams, and Jeff Howard won in a 3:48.8 clocking. Composing the Varsity 880 yard relay team was Dale, Dalton, Bob Scott, and Nichols. Their time was 1:38.5. The Fresh-Soph squad of Kent Leonard, Mark Kesler, Steve Karr and Jeff Clinebell raced to victory in a time of 1:47.2.

second placings M-S got. Herb's time of 11:09.8 was his best in this his first year in track. Others claiming second were Jack Eichelberger, discus (113 1/4"), Leonard, 120 yard high hurdles (17.6), Howard, 880 yard dash (2:11.7), James, mile, (5:09.1), Scott, 220 yard dash (25.4), Anderson, long jump (19'2 1/2") and Leonard again, in the low hurdles (24.0).

Claiming third were Eichelberger, shot put (36'3"), Greg Brown, high hurdles, (19.3), Rick Dawkins, pole vault (9'0"), Scott, 100 yard dash, (tie), Nichols, 220 yard dash (tie, 25.9), and Scott, long jump (18'3"). The Fresh-Soph mile relay team of Darrell Campbell, Craig Nichols, Jeff Clinebell, and Charlie Watson recorded a time of 4:46.4 in finishing third.

Both the S.V.C. Varsity and Fr-Soph meets were held at Mahomet this year, and in both meets the Bulldog's placed second to Argenta-Oreana. Varsity scores were Argenta—61 1/2, M-S—50, Farmer City-Mansfield—33, Heyworth—31 1/2, Fairbury-Cropsey—25, LeRoy—19, Fisher—10, Octavia—7, DeLand-Weldon—3, and Saybrook-Arrowsmith—0.

The results of the Fr-Soph meet were: Argenta—60 1/2, M-S—53, Fairbury—47, LeRoy—31 1/2, Farmer City-Mansfield—17, Heyworth—12, Fisher—9 1/2, DeLand—6, Octavia—3 1/2, and Saybrook—2. The only individual winners for the Bulldogs in this meet were Bill James, mile (5:04.1) and Brian Anderson, long jump (18'3").

Winners in the Varsity meet were Galen Dale, high jump (5'9"), Mark Nichols, low hurdles (21.9) and the mile relay team of Dale, Jeff Howard, Anderson, and Doug Williams in a 3:39.7 clocking.

Placing second were Bob Bantz, 880 yard dash, Doug Williams, pole vault and Anderson, 440 yard dash and

Lindsey, discus, and Dale, long jump. The only fourth place effort was by Jeff Howard, in the 880. Taking fifth were James, 2 mile, Dale, 100 yard dash, Eichelberger, discus, Bantz, mile and Bob Scott, 220 yard dash.

May 14th was the date of the LeRoy Invitational. M-S claimed first, garnering 98 1/2 points to out distance host LeRoy and Farmer City-Mansfield, who tied for second with 68 points. Next came Chenoa, 58 1/2 points. Rounding out the six team field were Tri Valley (11) and Central Catholic (9).

The Bulldog's first place winners were Anderson 440 yard dash (54.6), Bantz 880 (2:07.6), Dale, high jump, (5'10"), Williams, pole vault (11'0"), James, Fr-Soph mile (4:54.0) and the mile relay unit of Dale, Anderson, Williams and Howard in a 3:39.5 timing. The varsity 880 yard relay team of Dale, Williams, Nichols and Scott also was victorious, in a time of 1:37.0.

Second place finishers went to Bantz, mile, James, 2-mile, Nichols, low hurdles, Dale, long jump, and Eichelberger, shot put. Third places were awarded to Howard,
