

Uni High Runners Score Double Win

Uni High's cross-country team squeezed out a 28-29 win over Mahomet-Seymour and beat Tri-Valley 28-36 in a double dual meet at New Blinn Grove Tuesday. The Bulldogs topped Tri-Valley, 25-30.

Individual winner over the 2.9 mile course was Mahomet-Seymour's Mark Johnson, who ran 15:58. Trent Barnhart of Uni came in second in 16:05. Bill James was third for M-S in 16:38 and Chris Wilcock fourth for Uni in 17:25.

Mahomet-Seymour Harriers Top Paxton

Record Run At Paxton

PAXTON — Jim Pattin of St. Anne smashed Mike Lehman's meet record by 19 seconds to win the individual title and lead St. Anne to the team championship of the Mustang Invitational cross country meet here Saturday.

Pattin's time was 15:14.6 for the three mile layout at Paxton High School. Lehman's time last year was 15:33.6.

St. Anne placed five runners in the top 25 to score 86 points and take the meet.

Spartan Run Won By Hoopeston, Rorem

ST. JOSEPH — Gilman sophomore Reo Rorem, who may be yet another in a seemingly endless line of brilliant young Illinois distance runners, won the individual title in a three-mile time of 14:54.9 while Hoopeston unseated Effingham St. Anthony as team champion in the second annual Spartan Classic cross-country meet here Saturday.

The race began on Main Street, proceeded through town, and ended on the 50-yard line of the high school football field.

Hoopeston, led by Mike Hatfield's 12th-place finish, scored 144 points to outdistance the 33-team field, Hoopeston's Don Hasler was 18th, although he was fourth until he took a wrong turn and had to backtrack.

St. Anthony was second with 166 points with Monticello third (186), St. Anne fourth (211) and Clifton Central fifth (222).

Mattoon High School breezed to a third straight district cross country championship Tuesday at Scovill. Eisenhower's Robin Liddell repeated as individual champion.

Placing seven runners among the top 12, Mattoon was low with 31 points in the 16-team field. Each school's top five finishers figured in the point total.

Also qualifying for the Champaign sectional Saturday were Charleston, runner-up with 58 points; MacArthur, third with 122 points; Stephen Decatur, fourth with 141 points, and Argenta-Oreana, fifth with 184 points.

Members of the top three teams in the sectional run and the top 10 individual finishers advance to the state meet Nov. 3 in Peoria.

Mattoon should be in the Peoria lineup, judging from Tuesday's excellent showing. Liddell also should have no trouble advancing.

Liddell's time of 15:39.4 minutes for three miles bettered his 1972 time of 15:57.6. The course is hilly, which makes the time extremely low.

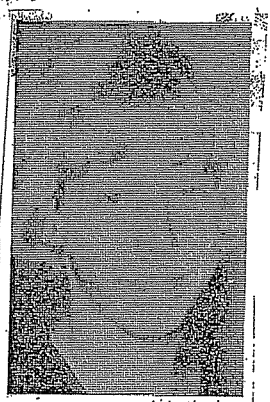

Having a son on the Stephen Decatur High School team has sharpened my perception about cross country.

It looks easy. Just run. In fact, cross country is a grueling, grinding test of self-discipline.

Not much glory. Not like the glory in football, that other autumn sport. Not much applause. A few relatives and girl friends on hand. No cheering grandstand. No headlines in the newspaper — unless you're Craig Virgin.

Just run, run, run. Run your tail off. Run up hills, run in the rain, run in the steamy heat.

Grind it out. Try to beat the kid in the blue jersey across the finish line. Try to beat him when your feet feel like lead and your gut has a twisting ache.

The cross country meets are fun. It's the practice that is tedious, boring, time-consuming, energy-sapping. That is, if you practice the right way.

Practice takes discipline. In cross country you are only as good as the amount of time you practice. So you must have self-discipline to keep running, running, running.

What makes a cross country runner run? Basically, the wish to excel, the competitive urge to prove yourself better

than the next guy. Many of the cross country runners are too small for football, or too timid! Cross country, like wrestling, is for the kid who can't throw a touchdown pass, can't score 20 points in basketball can't hit .300 in baseball.

Like newspaper writers, the cross country runner tries to beat the clock. He's forever seeking to lower the time it takes to cross the finish line.

So the cross country runner runs and runs and runs. It doesn't take any skill to run. Just stamina.

But it's a thinking-man's sport nevertheless. Because you have to think hard about running that long.

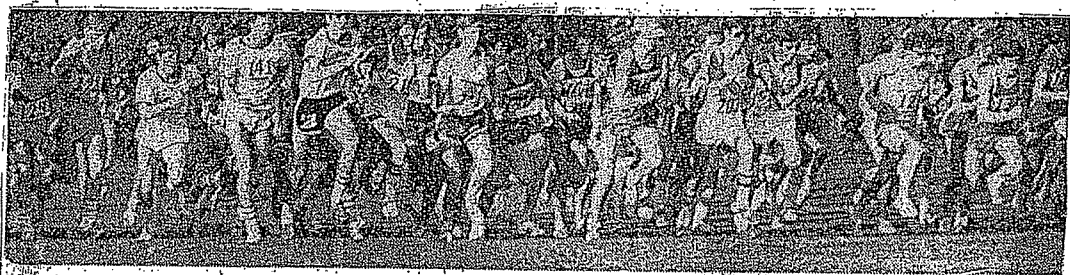
