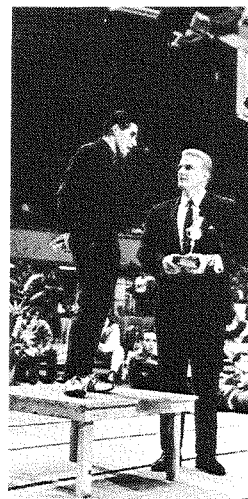

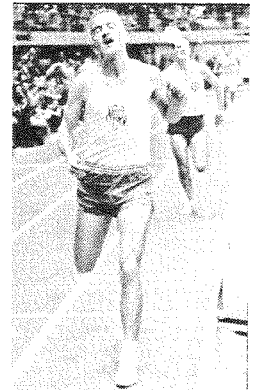
Steve Prefontaine after two-mile win in '72.

Steve Prefontaine is a young man who does things by the numbers, accomplishing goals consecutively with the precision of a smooth-running machine.

During his recently concluded college career at the University of Oregon, he won the NCAA outdoor three mile championship four consecutive seasons and the NCAA cross country title three straight years.

Tonight he aims for another triple. The Athlete of the Meet in the last two Times Indoor Games, Prefontaine could become the first performer to win the award three consecutive times in the 15-year history of the meet.

Distance runners like Prefontaine apparently have an advantage in winning the award. In 14 years, milers and two milers have been named seven times. Pole vaulters are a close second with five selections.

Bob Seagren is the only other man besides Pre to be named the meet's outstanding performer on two occasions.

Two high school athletes have stolen the spotlight in the meet — Tommy Sullivan in the mile in 1961 and Paul Wilson in the pole vault in 1965.

Eight of the winners (four pole vaulters) have broken world records.

Perhaps the most dramatic race in the history of the Times Games came in 1964 when Bill Crothers of Canada fell off the track with two laps to go in the 1,000-yard run.

He returned to the track after losing at least 35 yards and nearly caught Jim Dupree of the Striders at the tape. Both runners were timed in 2:11.9.

Dupree won the race, but Crothers won the plaudits of the crowd and became the only non-winner in the history of the meet to be named the top athlete.

No race received as much pre-meet publicity as the 600-yard run in 1970. The field: Lee Evans, Olympic gold medalist at 400 meters; Ralph Doubell, Olympic gold medalist at 800 meters; and Martin McGrady, world indoor record holder at 600 yards.

Evans, using his hard-driving, arm-pumping style had the lead most of the way, but McGrady, the acknowledged "Chairman of the Boards," made a last move and flew past Evans in the last 25 yards to win the race and the Athlete of the Meet award.

Track fans have always loved upsets and one of the biggest in indoor history occurred in 1968 when the greatest two milers in the world were upstaged by George Young, a 31-year-old school teacher from Arizona.

Young defeated Ron Clarke, Kerry Pearce, Kerry O'Brien and Tracy Smith to capture the top athlete award.

For the past two years, a woman Athlete of the Meet has also been named with Kathy Gibbon winning in 1972 and Wendy Koenig last year.

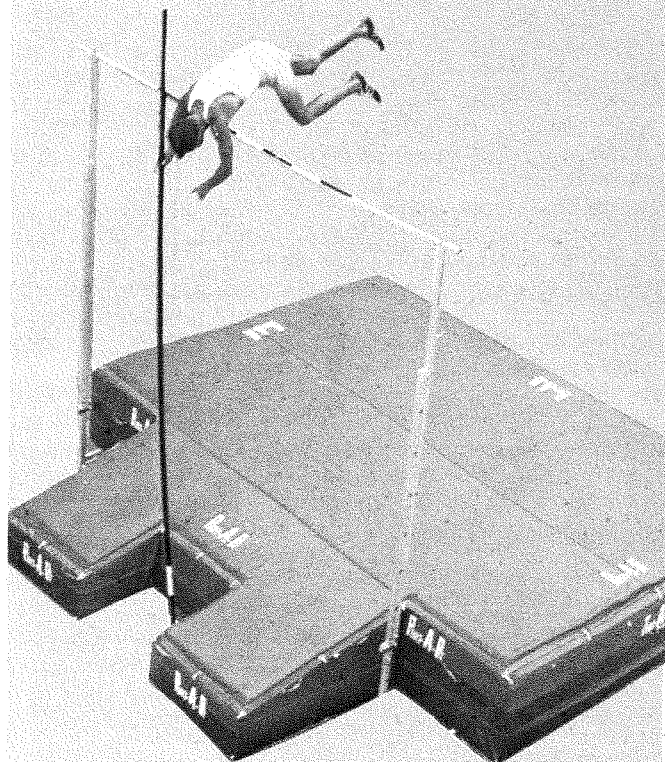
With one of the most outstanding fields ever assembled for an indoor track meet on hand tonight, this year's selection could be one of the more difficult.
