# Unity Vs. Mahomet For County Crown

## County Preview

A two-school battle for the title between defending champion Unity and Mahomet-Seymour, strong runner-up last year, is in prospect at the 55th annual Champaign County track and field meet, scheduled at Tolono Friday evening.

Field events and preliminaries on the track will get under way at 5:30 p. m. Track finals will begin at 7 p. m.

Host Unity claimed its 12th County crown in 24 years of endeavor last May by a 72-66 count, although Mahomet-Seymour led 59-52 with just three events to go. Indication that another close duel between the same schools for the 1974 trophy is in the offing came last week when Unity's headed Mahomet-Seymour 73-71 in a quadrangular meet.

As usual, assaults on the record list will spice the team and individual strivings this year. Actually, not many marks appear to be in danger, although new ones will certainly be set in three events, each new: the 440-yard relay, now a varsity rather than a freshman-sophomore competition; the 330-yard low hurdles, instead of 180-yard lows and a triple jump.

Dash star Jay Miller of Unity, one of just three holdover individual champions, may well crack the 100 record of 10.2 seconds as he seeks to claim that event for the third straight time. He has a wind-aided 9.7 performance to his credit this spring.

Miller also will be out to extend his rule of the 220 dash.

Other defending champs are Mark Nichols of Mahomet-Seymour and Gary Bensyl of St. Joseph-Ogden, both hurdlers. Nichols, winner of the lows in '73, has the 180-to-330-yards adjustment to make.

Mahomet-Seymour, St. Joseph-Ogden, and Unity have posted times of 47.0, 47.5, and 47.8 respectively in varsity 440 relay running this season, all of them

under the 47.9 record Rantoul still owns in the frosh-soph 440 relay—19 years after setting it and 14 years after withdrawing from County competition.

That there is a constant erosion of records, however, is obvious from the fact that Rantoul, a monstrous power in County track when still in the field—the Eagles won 21 of the last 27 team titles it tied for, and 16 of 17 from 1933 through 1949 retains only two mentions on the individual record list. Kenneth Eads set the existing 880-run mark of 2:02.0 in 1936, and Bill Gibbs notched the 120-yard high hurdles standard of 15.5 in 1959. But both have been matched by later athletes, so their records are shared.

While Miller will spearhead Unity's bid to repeat as champion, he'll have noteworthy helpers in Andy Eanis, who placed second, to him in both dashes last year; Ron Burwell, especially in the mile; Brad Craven in the high jump; and in all relays.

Mahomet-Seymour's formidable forces include, in addition to hurdler Nichols, Brian Anderson and Danny Graham in the 440 with Anderson also a top bet in the long jump. Jeff Howard in the 880, Bill James in the mile, and a first-rate 440 relay team.

St. Joseph-Ogden, third last year, looks to hurdler Bensyl and distance runner Tony Johnson as leaders. ABL, fourth in '73, boasts sophomore strider Roger Mohr and junior vaulter Ed Bosch, whose respective 4:39.6 and 12-6 bests to date are also County bests.

Remaining County schools are expected to be also-rans, but each has at least one standout. Homer's top performer is eight-tosser Tom Edwards, Fisher's is jumper Gordon Quick, and Urbana Uni High's is distance runner Tom Dworschak.

# Mahomet-Seymour Roars To Title In County Track

TOLONO—Mahomet-Seymour's bustling Bulldogs, claiming seven first places and eight seconds, overpowered defending champion Unity and the rest of the field to win the 55th annual Champaign County track and field meet here Friday night.

Coach Frank Dutton's diversified and talented team piled up 97½ points, a total reminiscent of some that Rantoul used to run up when it still competed in County athletics. Unity scored a highly respectable 72½, actually ½ point more than it took to deny the Bulldogs last year.

It's Mahomet-Seymour's second County track crown in four years, but only its third in the 55 series has gone on.

The rest of the order of finish was the same as last year: St. Joseph-Ogden third, ABL fourth, Homer fifth, Fisher sixth, and Unit High seventh.

Mahomet-Seymour's event victories were racked up by five different individuals and two relay foursomes. One Bulldog, Art Farley, broke the high jump record, lifting it a half inch to 6 feet ½ inch, while another, Mark Nichols, repeated as low hurdle champ, although this year he had to cover almost twice the distance with the old 180-yard test lengthened to 330.

Mark Johnson, battling back from a bout with mononucleosis, shaded Tony Johnson of St. Joe-Ogden in a stirring stretch duel in the mile run, winning by 3 seconds with a time of 4:39.3. Jeff Howard, who ran second to teammate Bob Bantz last year, took over rule of the 880 this time in 2:05.9—Bantz passed up a chance to win the event four straight years by not reporting for track this season. Brian Anderson edged 440 sidekick Denny Graham, 52.7 to 52.8 which was just 2 seconds shy of the County record in the quarter mile.

The Bulldogs prevailed in the 440 and mile relays with Anderson and Graham running legs on each.

Unity's effort featured, as expected, dashman Jay Miller. For the third straight year, he won both 100- and 220-yard sprints, and for the second straight year, buddy Andy Ennis chased him across the finish line. Ennis, however, was a winner in the long jump, leaping 20 feet 6½ inches, three inches more than Mahomet-Seymour's Steve Karr.

The Rockets of Joe Summerville claimed the 880 relay with Ennis, Mike Wood, Dick Miller, and Jay Miller combining for a 1:36.1 timing, just 3 seconds off the County record.

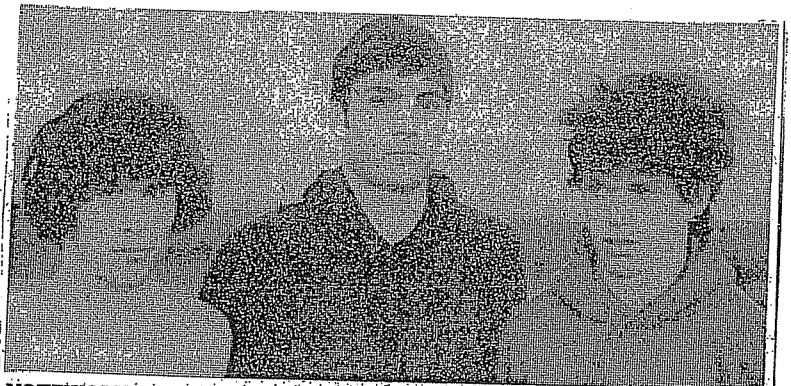
St. Joe-Ogden was tops in just one event—the 880 freshman-sophomore relay with Mark Pausch, Dave Williams, and Greg Wells, all frosh, and Lynden Stark, a soph, scoring—but placed in enough other events to outpoint challenger ABL for third place.

ABL, like Homer and Fisher, won two events, and both in noteworthy fashion. Junior Ed Bosch broke the pole vault record, set last year by 1½ inches with a clearance of 12 feet 9½ inches; he didn't miss until the final height he tried—13 feet—and then seemingly because he virtually ran himself ragged competing in the dashes and a relay as well as the vault, Roger Mohr captured the 440. The run and this became the only sophomore win at the meet to win an event.

## Mahomet-Seymour wins Sangamon track crown

Mahomet-Seymour High School has a solid track and a sound track program to go with it.

The Bulldogs had a field day Monday after the oft-postponed 16th annual Sangamon Valley Conference Track and Field Meet was switched from Farm City to the Mahomet oval.

Coach Frank Dutton's charges placed in all 17 events on the program. They won two of the three relay races and finished second in the other. They also placed two men in 10 of the 14 individual events to far overshadow the rest of the field with a record total of 95 points.

Two-time defending champion Argenta-Oreana was second with 66 points; Farmer City-Mansfield finished with 29 to edge Fairbury-Cropsey by a point for third place. Heyworth took fifth with 18, two more than LeRoy. Fisher had 13 and Octavia seven, Saybrook-Arrowsmith and DeLand-Weldon failed to score.

Brian Anderson, Barry Willoughby, Danny Graham, Mark Johnson, Art Farley, Bob Scott, Steve Karr and Mark Nichols were among the Bulldog stand-outs Monday.

Anderson won the long jump with a leap of 20-7, finished third in the 440 and ran the anchor leg on the winning mile relay team. Willoughby won the pole vault with a leap of 11-6, finished fourth in the discus and ran the opening leg of the mile relay. Graham won the 440 in a fine time of 52.5 with a stiff wind prevailing. Graham also

ran a mile relay leg. Johnson won the mile with a 4:43.5 clocking while Farley was the high jump leader with a 6-0 effort.

Karr, Scott, Nichols, Jeff Howard and Bill James contributed valuable points while failing to gain any individual wins. Karr was third in the long jump, fourth in the 100 and 220 and ran on the winning 880-yard relay team. Scott was fifth in the triple jump, second in the 100, third in 220 and anchored the 880-yard relay team.

Nichols was edged by Argenta-Oreana's Scott Doane by a tenth of a second in the grueling 330-yard low hurdles. He also ran on the 440 and 880-yard relay foursomes. Howard was second to Argenta-Oreana's Tony Richards in the 880 and ran a mile relay leg. James was third in the two-mile and fourth in the mile.

Doane and Argenta-Oreana teammate Rolf Wilson were the only double winners in the meet. Doane won the 120-yard highs in 15.5 and came back with a 40.7 in the lows. Wilson set a meet record of 142-9/16 in the discus and won the shot put with a toss of 49-7/8.

Other winners were Farmer City-Mansfield's Dan Deffenbaugh in the triple jump, LeRoy's Joe Ommen in the two-mile, Argenta-Oreana's Dave Schoen in the 100, Heyworth's Mike Walden in the 220 and the Argenta-Oreana 440-yard relay team. Ommen won the two-

mile in 10:29.3 and finished second in the mile. Deffenbaugh went 39-6 in the triple jump and was second in the long jump.
