# Down Memory Lane At The Nationals

Eighty-five glorious chapters of American track and field history, studded with heroic deeds and sterling performances, have been written into the record books at the annual United States Track and Field Championships of the A.A.U. Always the grand climax of our outdoor season, this meet has produced a bevy of thrilling and unforgettable moments—a few of which we shall try to recall for you.

We begin our stroll down memory lane in Milwaukee. How can we forget that great 1934 meet in which Princeton's Bill Bonthron faced Glenn Cunningham of Kansas in their rubber match? It was a blistering hot day and when the 1500 meter run got underway it had hit 95 degrees. Gene Venzke set the early pace and at 500 yards Cunningham moved to the front as he had at Princeton two weeks before when he set the world record for the mile. Cunningham set a scorching pace to try to kill off Bonthron's dreaded finishing kick. He began to draw away from the field and at the end of three laps he led Bonthron by ten yards. Going into the last turn the mighty Kansas was ahead by 15 yards and the crowd had just about conceded another Cunningham victory.

But Bonthron gathered himself and began his famous sprint. With a withering blast he cut down the lead to eight yards as they rounded into the stretch. Then, Bonthron ducked his head and came charging down the straight to close the gap with every bounding stride. Cunningham tried to hold him off but Bonthron was flying now and 20 yards from the tape he drew even with Glenn. And then, inch by inch, he began to forge ahead. As they surged to the finish, Bonthron turned and looked Cunningham in the eye, tearing through the tape with a world record of 3:48.8. It was one of the most spectacular races in track history.

Then, there was that great six mile in San Diego—perhaps the greatest ever run. It was in 1965. Lt. Billy Mills, the 1964 Olympic champion at 10,000 meters, met Gerry Lindgren, hero of the 1964 US-USSR meet. They both ran at a quick tempo and Mills led almost all the way. Once in awhile, Lindgren took over the pace but Mills soon regained the lead. When they came into the homestretch for the end, they were side by side, locked in a drive to the tape with only inches

between them. Then, Mills forged ahead slightly and crossed the finish line first with Lindgren only six-hundredths of a second behind him. Both were given credit for a world record of 27:11.6. It was the first world record by an American at any distance over two miles.

And how about Grover Klemmer's world record at Philadelphia! In the 100-degree heat at historic Franklin Field in 1941, Klemmer beat a classic field in, what was up to that time, the greatest metric quarter ever run.

The race began in a chute and was run around one turn, the custom in those days. New York's Al Diebolt led up the first straightaway followed by Southern California's Hubie Kerns, the N.C.A.A. champion, and California's Klemmer. Diebolt led them into the turn and fifty yards from the finish with Diebolt on the pole, Klemmer began his drive taking Kerns with him. Klemmer was on the outside and Kerns was only a foot or so behind as another Trojan, Cliff Bourland, unleashed a terrific sprint nearly catching Kerns. They hit the tape in this order with Klemmer winning in 46 flat for a world record. Kerns and Bourland were timed in 46.1 followed by Diebolt with 46.4—terrific times in 1941.

And who can forget Jim Ryun's world record mile at Bakersfield in 1967? Glenn Cunningham had set a world record of 4:06.7 at Princeton in 1934 only to lose it to Syd Wooderson of Great Britain in 1937. No American had held the mile record since Cunningham until Ryun arrived on the scene. Ryun had set a world record of 3:51.3 at Berkeley in 1966 and vowed to break his own record at Bakersfield

He set a blistering pace and was never headed. He passed the first quarter in 59, the half in 1:58.9 and the 1320 in 2:57.4. His last lap was a scorching 53.7 and he crossed the finish in 3:51.1—quite a performance for a 20-year-old.

A year later came the "night of speed" at Sacramento. Three sprinters broke the world 100-meter record and there were 32 clockings of 10.1 or faster in the greatest 100-meter competition of all time.

Charlie Greene won the championship beating Jimmy Hines as both clocked 10 flat with a gusty wind at their backs. In the semi-finals Hines won the first race in 9.9 for a world record with Ronnie Ray Smith getting the same time in second place. Then, Greene tied this record in his semi-final. In the final, Greene led Hines off the blocks and Hines was never able to catch him. This avenged a bitter defeat suffered by Greene who had lost to Hines in a photo-finish the year before.

Speaking of sprinting did you know that the first 9.2 and the first 9.1 for 100 yards occurred in these championships? At Randalls Island, New York, in 1961, Frank Budd blasted down the straightaway to erase Mel Patton's 9.3 record and become the first

man in history to run 100 yards in 9.2 seconds. That didn't last long, however. In 1963 a burly football player with blazing speed bounced down a track in St. Louis in 9.1 for a new record. That gridiron star was Bob Hayes, now a wide receiver with the Dallas Cowboys.

A huge crowd set up a mighty roar into the night at Fresno in 1940 as two runners crossed the finish line at the end of the 1500 meter run. They were cheering for Walter Mehl, the winner, who had just set a new American record of 3:47.9, but they were also saying goodbye to Glenn Cunningham, who at 30 years of age, had just run the fastest 1500 meters (3:48.0) of his life in second place.

In 1935, at Lincoln, Nebraska, the crowd came to see the fabulous Jesse Owens who earlier in the year had set or tied six world records in one day and a few weeks before had won four NCAA titles. Owens was there all right, but this was not his day. Instead the day belonged to a sensational sophomore from Temple University in Philadelphia—Eulace Peacock. Owens finished third in the 100 meters won by Peacock in a windy 10.2, beating the world mark, with Ralph Metcalfe in second place. What was even more surprising was Peacock's victory over Owens in the long jump. Both went over 26 feet, Peacock for the first time, as he won with a great leap of 26-3 eclipsing the recognized world mark.

The 1970 quarter mile at Bakersfield had one of the classiest fields in history—Lee Evans, Wayne Collett and Curtis Mills among others. But the race was won by UCLA's John Smith who outkicked them all in a great homestretch battle. The following year at Eugene, Smith broke the world record with a dazzling 44.5 as Collett in second place tied the old record of 44.7.

The 220 at St. Louis in 1963 ended in a tie between Henry Carr and Paul Drayton. This was not the first dead heat in an outdoor AAU sprint race. Back in 1939 Clyde Jeffrey and Mozel Ellerbe ran a dead heat in a preliminary race and Jeffrey went on to beat Ellerbe in the final.

In 1937 Bill Sefton, Earl Meadows, George Varoff and little known Cornelius Warmerdam tied in the pole vault at 14-7 5/9, all bettering the listed world mark. Warmerdam went on to win six more titles setting a global mark of 15-1 1/8 in 1940 at Fresno while representing the San Francisco Olympic Club.

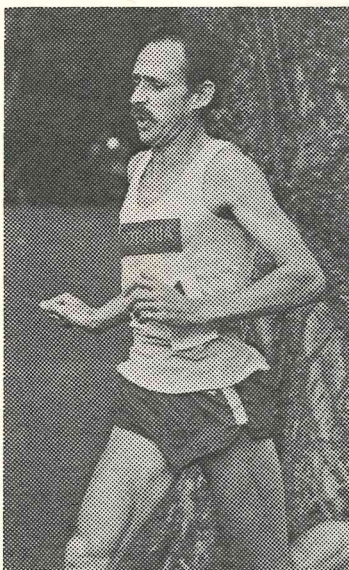
# Run of The Times

Jack Foster is a 42-year-old clerk in New Zealand's Ministry of Works. Fred Grace, 77, is a retired Los Angeles businessman. Gerald McIntosh, 28, is a Northridge physician. Parker Williams, 37, of Alhambra, operates a scrap metal company.

Tom Cory is a Los Angeles attorney, Phil Ryan a teacher in La Puente, Bob Herman a Palos Verdes fireman, Dick Blum a Manhattan Beach bank manager, Mark Cushner a student at UCLA and Bill Dietsch a Times photographer.

They have just one thing in common—aside from being a little crazy:

At 8 a.m. Saturday, June 22, they will be among the mob taking off from UCLA's Drake Stadium on a 26-mile, 385-yard run through the streets of Westwood.

It's the first annual Marathon of The Times to be run in conjunction with the National AAU track and field championships June 21-22 at UCLA.

It's also a fine bit of madness, with the field ranging from such "high rollers" as Foster, Commonwealth Games marathon silver medalist, plus Tom Fleming, one of America's best, to the run-for-fun leather lungs who have been jamming the weekend hills and byways of Southern California in increasing numbers.

"Soon, Boston will be just a distant memory

(that's a pun). 'The Times marathon can't help but grow into the biggest event of its kind," said Parker Williams, coordinator for the AAU long-distance running committee that helped organize the Westwood agony.

Nothing like a little enthusiasm, and if there's anything the long distance nut has, that's precisely it.

"The beauty of this marathon is that it gives us ordinary weekend crawlers an opportunity to rub shoulders with the high rollers," Parker said.

Parker himself figures to finish about two hours behind the leaders, but he and Foster will wind up with the same T-shirts.

And, it's all for charity. Each entrant puts up \$100 to run—with the money going to The Times Fund. There's no charge for spectators.

"It's like the March of Dimes only it's a run for dollars," said Williams. "Those who don't have \$100 can raise it by knocking on doors."

★  
Bill Dietsch, the photographer, is an example of what Williams has in mind. To raise his entry fee, Dietsch put out handbills. With apologies to the Billie Jean King people, there's a picture of an amply-proportioned beauty at the top of the handbill.

"Body For Sale," says the large type. In smaller print, it then advises "not that one" (with an arrow to the girl), "this one" (with an arrow to Dietsch). "See our intrepid photographer run against the best in the world . . . See him lose another 18 pounds . . . See him throw up in downtown Westwood," further suggests his poster. At \$5 each from friends, Dietsch raised his fee. Now, all he's got left is 26 miles, 385 yards.

Everybody seems to want in. A poignant letter of intent signed by Jack Lee at the Warm Springs Rehabilitation Center:

"Well, me and George Bruce here at the center would like to run. But we don't make that kind of money. We told our director about this marathon of The Times and we are hoping for the best.

"You see, we are alcoholic patients here at the center and we are trying to find a way to raise the money for a good cause. Me and Bruce are the only two distance runners ever produced by the center. If we raise the \$200, we will see you June 22."

★

For the purists, Jack Foster's presence insures a top winning time. Foster has been described as track's answer to football's George Blanda. Jack didn't run a competitive race until he was 32.

He finished eighth behind Shorter in the '72 Olympics. But earlier this year, at age 42, he was second in the Commonwealth Games marathon in 2:11.18—two minutes faster than Shorter's Munich gold medal clocking.

We are not quite sure why so many people like to run so far, but they are obviously among us. And next time somebody tells you about the soft and pampered American, you say wait a minute.

There are 1,600 registered long distance runners in Southern California alone. There are dozens of clubs running for health and happy daze every weekend.

There's a club in Palos Verdes that runs 15 miles every Sunday morning, and has brunch at a different member's home each week.

A recent Palos Verdes long-distance event drew 1,100 entrants. The 1974 Boston Marathon had more than 1,700 runners. There were 5,000 in the Bay-to-Breakers run this year in San Francisco.

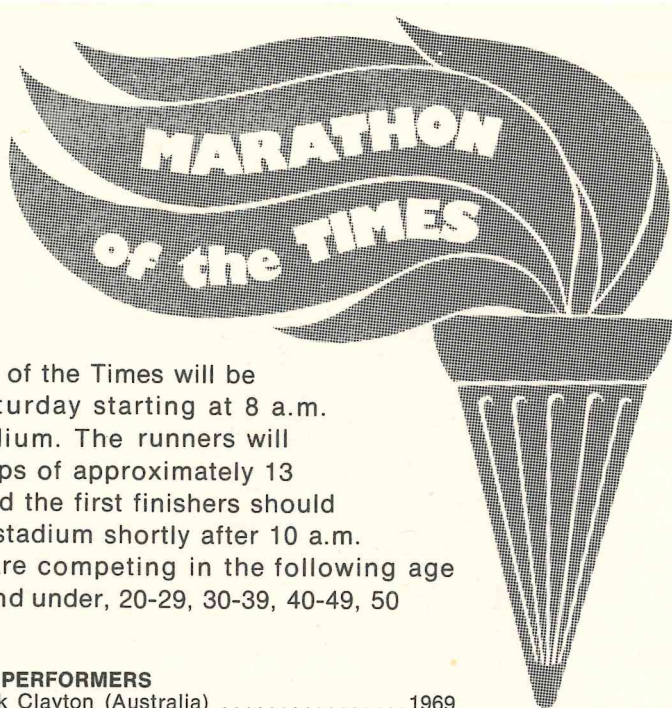
"The course for The Times marathon should be a lot of fun," said Williams. "It's two 13-mile loops climaxed by two full laps in the stadium."

From the Drake Stadium starting point it will move down Westwood Blvd., angle off at LeConte, travel over Gayley and Montana avenues, swing down Sepulveda past Sawtelle, roll along San Vicente Blvd. past the Brentwood Country Club and then start back toward UCLA.

"We'll have prizes for everybody," said Williams. Everybody entering gets a "\$100 T-shirt" with the proper lettering. Each finisher will get a plaque with his own picture on it. There are 10 categories of rewards for age groups, school groups and sex groups.

The Marathon of the Times will be conducted Saturday starting at 8 a.m. in Drake stadium. The runners will cover two loops of approximately 13 miles each and the first finishers should return to the stadium shortly after 10 a.m. The runners are competing in the following age groups: 19 and under, 20-29, 30-39, 40-49, 50 and over.

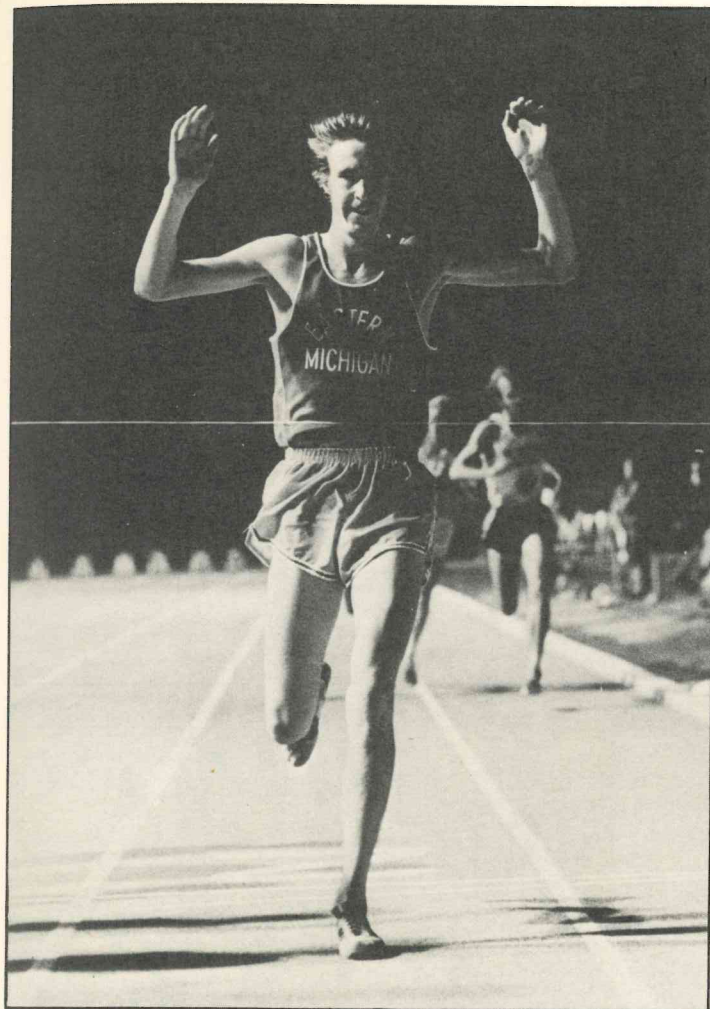
