Tonight marks the 16th time the world's top track and field athletes have been assembled to benefit the youth projects of the Los Angeles Times Fund.

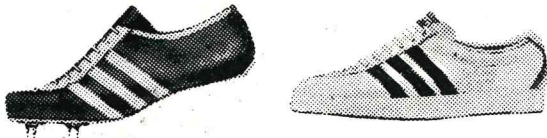

This facility has been designed to serve as a national clearing house for the sport of track and field at all levels.

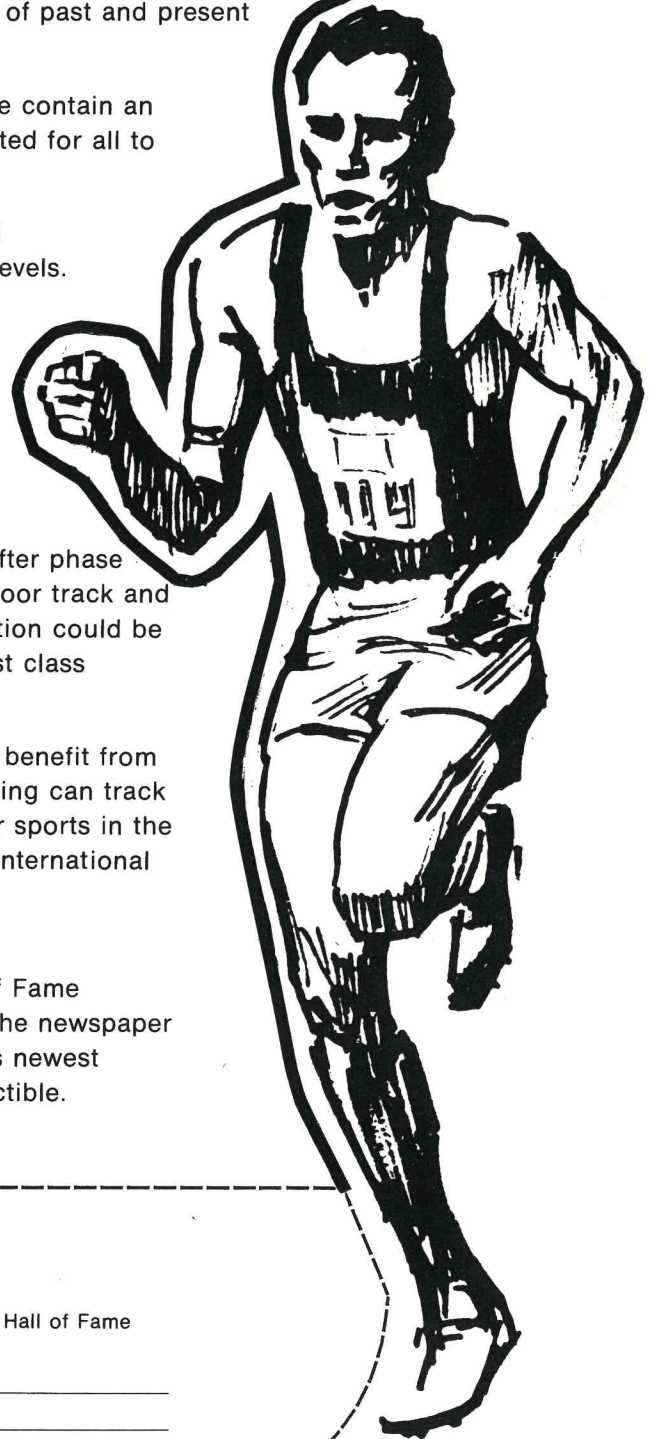
