

M-S boys run 2nd to Chrisman at St. Joe Classic

Coach John King's boys cross country team recorded Mahomet-Seymour's most notable performance of the season last Saturday, placing second to reigning state champion Chrisman in the 28-school Spartan Classic at St. Joseph.

The Chrisman Cardinals of coach Roger Beals virtually ran away from the field with a score of 76. Mahomet-Seymour nipped Clinton, 147 to 148, for the runnerup position, while

Normal U-High was fourth with 159, giving the Corn Belt Conference places 2-3-4.

Bulldog Danny Nielsen was declared top junior in the meet as he finished second to Shelbyville star Jeremy Skinner. The winner's time was 15:07.56; Nielsen's was 15:30.11. Also contributing to Mahomet's effort were Brian Easter, 11th in 15:58.54; Burt Huddleston, 18th in 16:06 and Hans Waters, 26th in 16:26.

Chad Beals led Chrisman by

placing seventh in 15:55.49—he was named the meet's top sophomore.

Chrisman's defending state champion girls also prevailed, posting a score of 48. St. Joseph-Ogden was runnerup with 59, Unity with 83, Urbana Uni High fourth with 119, while Mahomet-Seymour ran 10th with 225. A field of 13 competed. No M-S girls placed in the first 20.

Urbana beat the M-S girls, 18-

39. Mahomet times were: Williamson, fifth in 16:31; Mattingly, sixth in 16:50; Lake, seventh in 16:55 and Connor, ninth in 17:35.

In the latest Class A state boys ratings, Mahomet-Seymour ranked fourth, behind Chrisman, Tremont and Kankakee McNamara.
