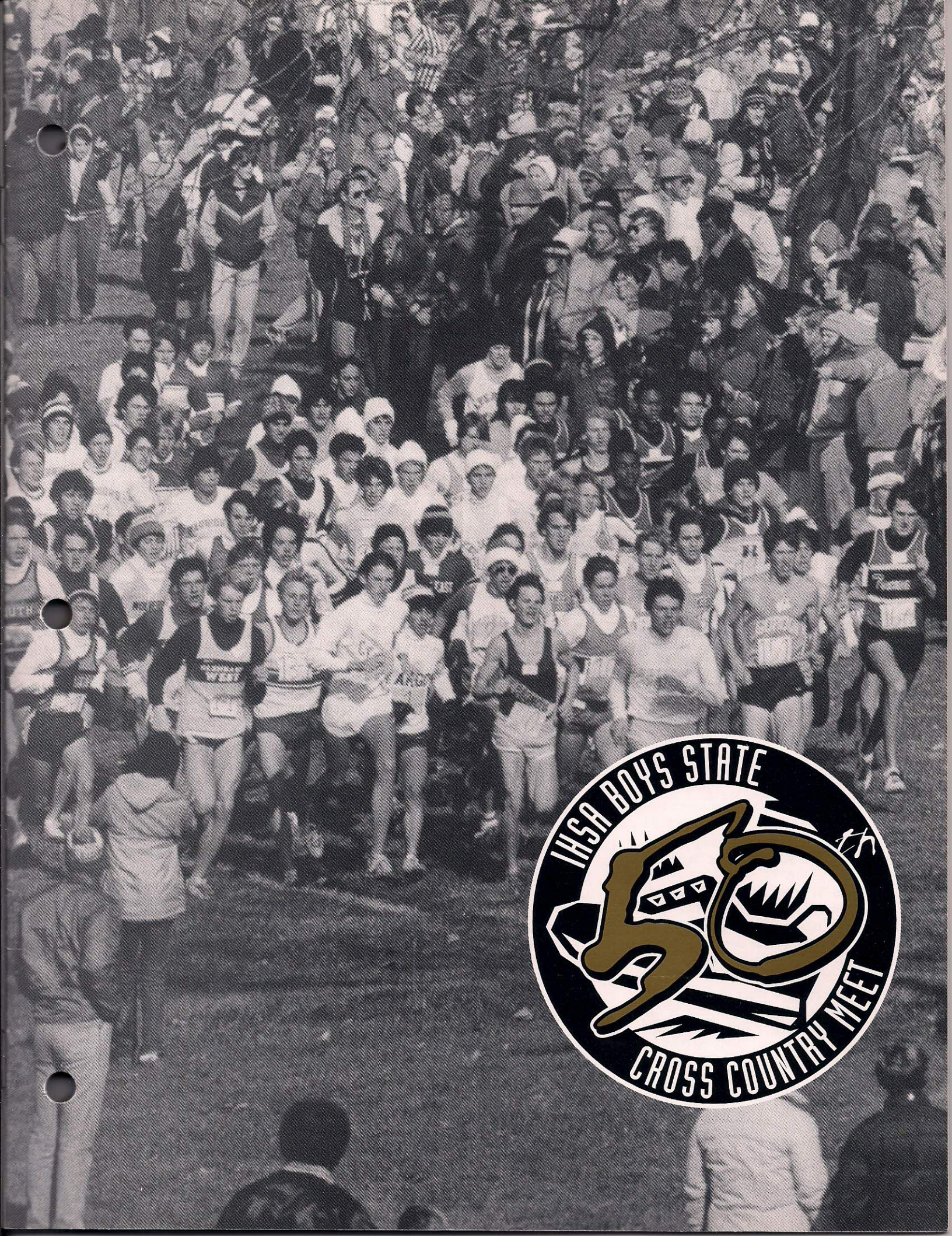

50 Years of IHSA® Cross Country

Roy Gummerson had a good thing going in 1945, and the Illinois High School Association wanted him to know it.

And the IHSA wanted to share in it, too. "Albert Willis called me and asked me to come on over to Bloomington," Gummerson remembered. "He wanted me to ride with him to Springfield to discuss cross country."

In those days Gummerson was coaching and teaching at Peoria Woodruff. He hosted an unofficial state championship meet, the Woodruff Invitational, featuring nearly 40 teams.



The success of Roy Gummerson's invitational meets at Peoria Woodruff convinced the IHSA that a state cross country meet would be a hit.

"He said to me, 'Your meet is successful. Give me a little of the program,'" Gummerson said. "We talked about it and he said, 'We're going to have a state meet next year. You'll be the chairman of that group.'"

And so if the National Football League got its start 76 years ago in a Decatur car dealership, let it be known that the IHSA state cross country competition was born during a drive from Bloomington to Springfield.

As we celebrate 50 years of cross country in Illinois, names jump out at us: Ernie Eveland, Craig Virgin, Weymouth Kirkland, Joe Newton, Dana Miroballi, Tom Graves... the list can go on for, oh, 50 years.

We take our high school sports seriously in Illinois, and cross country is no exception. How else can you explain why

thousands of people would line the Detweiller Park course in Peoria on the first Saturday of November every year when it's either very cold or very wet or a little bit of both? It's tradition.

"I remember telling Willis, 'This will catch fire,'" Gummerson says. "Now the slow runners are as fast as the fast ones."

There have been Olympians (Virgin, Mike Durkin, Rick Wohlhuter, Mark Deady and Jim Spivey to name a few) and coaching legends. College recruiters wouldn't miss the meet for anything, because some of America's best talent is on display.

"Illinois is one of the top cross country states in the union," says Newton, who has won an unprecedented 19 state titles since 1962. "Our state runs the meet so fantastically. Ours is first class; it's one of the best."

And it's been that way since back in...

1946

The first state meet is contested at Urbana Country Club on a two-mile course designed by Gummerson. The first team champion is Paris, which begins a four-year run of state titles with a 90-102 victory over Chicago Lane Tech.

Legendary coach Ernie Eveland guides Paris to the title, the first of three state titles Eveland will be around for.

The individual champion is Warren Druetzler of LaGrange Lyons, who tours the course in 10:07.8. George Twigg of Paris is second, the first of three Paris runners over the next five years to place second. Druetzler goes on to be the 1947 track mile champion, and Twigg is coming off the state 880 title during the spring of 1946.

1947

It's a repeat for Paris as Bob Collenberger takes individual honors in 9:58. Bob Malmstrom of Moline is second in the two-mile race at Urbana.

Paris finishes with 30 points and handily beats Des Plaines Maine Township by 29 points.

Many of the same Paris athletes will play on Eveland's second state championship basketball team later in the school year.

"All his basketball players had to run cross country," Gummerson remembered about Eveland. "Shorty did a nice job with the kids."

Eveland remains the fourth-winningest coach in Illinois high school basketball history with a 779-175 record. He wasn't a bad cross country coach, either.

1948

Paris and Eveland make it three in a row with a 23-73 margin over Washburn.

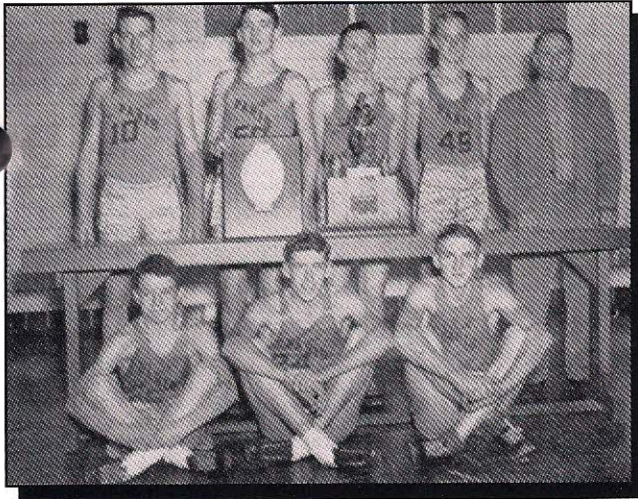
The Paris team that scores the second-fewest points in state meet history has all five scoring runners among the top 17 placers, led by runner-up Glen Curtis.

Stacy Siders of Buffalo Tri-City, one of the most accomplished distance runners of his era, wins the title on the two-mile Urbana course in 9:55.3. Siders had won the state 880 title in the spring of 1948 and goes on to win the state mile title in the spring of 1949.

A new name shows up in the final team standings as well. Elmhurst York places third with 105 points. We'll read more about them later.

1949

The race is shortened to 1.9 miles and H.D. "Deac" Sweeley replaces Eveland as Paris coach, but the results are very famil-

iar. Paris wins its fourth straight state title 36-72 over Evanston.

James Henry of Evanston takes individual honors in 9:35.1, and Irv Reitz of Rock Island is second. It marks the first time in the meet's history that a Paris runner doesn't finish either first or second.

Eveland was relieved of his coaching duties after a dispute with school personnel. It will take 34 years for any team to challenge Paris' streak of four straight state titles.

1950

The race moves back to 2.0 miles at Urbana, and that suits Steve Murphy of Chicago Calumet just fine. Murphy becomes the first—and only—state champion to come out of the Chicago Public League as he wins in 9:47.6, just ahead of Paris' Chuck Metheny.

A new team champion is crowned as well. Chicago Heights Bloom and coach E.R. Nelson pull off what many thought was impossible, beating Paris 49-70 for the state title. It would be Paris' last hurrah. The school hasn't finished among the top five at the state meet since.

1951

One of the state's all-time great coaches, Gene Armer, leads host Urbana to the state title 21-61 over Lyons, coached by Gene Armer's brother, Max. The temperature is 18 degrees at race time, and a 30 mph wind from the southwest is blowing right in the runners' faces at the Savoy course.

The Tigers set a record for fewest points in a state meet by having all five scoring runners among the top 16 team finishers. Interestingly Urbana lost 51-54

to Danville in the Big 12 Conference meet earlier in the season.

Chuck Metheny of Paris becomes the first state-meet runner-up to claim the title the following season, winning in 10:22.4. Verlon Sheuring of Urbana is second, 20 yards behind Metheny, the 1952 state track champion at 880 yards. Urbana's John Mock is fourth overall and the No. 2 team runner while teammate Tom Luker is sixth (No. 3 team runner), Leonard Wilson is 12th (No. 7) and John Hedgecock is 16th (No. 8).

For the third year in a row, Gummerson's Woodruff team is knocking on the door, moving up to third place with 72.

1952

After a six-year run in Urbana, the state meet moves to Peoria Country Club and a hilly 1.9-mile course designed by Gummerson. Guess who wins the state title?

Gummerson's Woodruff team scores 37 points and unseats Urbana. It's the first—and last—team state title Woodruff has won in any sport. Urbana is second with 80.

"They were trying to pick a central location and said, 'Let's go to Peoria,'" Gummerson remembered. "I told them, 'I can fix up a good course.'"

Running on familiar terrain, Woodruff's Charles Hakes wins the state title in 10:16.6 over Dale Nevel of Marengo. But the meet's run at Peoria Country Club is a short one.

"The country club was a great place," Gummerson said. "The argument was that some of the teams had no hilly grounds to run on so they wanted to move it back to where there was a little bit of each, hills and flat."

1953

So the meet is moved to Urbana Country Club, a much less challenging 1.9-mile course.

Evanston, under Emil Schultz, wins its first state cross country title 111-119 over Toledo Cumberland. The top five teams are separated by just 38 points in the closest state meet in history.

The Wildkits go 1-2 in the individual race with Louis Kujawinski winning in 9:21.6, just in front of teammate John

Hitt. It's the first of only two times in history that runners from the same team have finished 1-2 in the state meet.

1954

The Urbana C.C. course goes back to 2.0 miles for a year, and for the fifth time in the five years since the Paris reign ended, there is a new state champion. Maywood Proviso, under the direction of Harold Monilaw, knocks off Gummerson's Woodruff team 71-121.

Fred Sandoval of East Moline United wins in 9:34 over Dan Inrie of Joliet.

1955

Another Armer moves into the winner's circle as Max's LaGrange Lyons team captures its first state title 95-122 over Chicago Englewood at Urbana Country Club.

Jim Bowers of DeKalb ends the dream of East Moline United's Fred Sandoval to be the first repeat state champion as Bowers covers the 1.9-mile course in 9:15.2.

1956

LaGrange Lyons repeats as state champion for Max Armer by a 102-113 margin over Rock Falls at Urbana Country Club's 1.9-mile course.

Individual honors go to Brian White of Rockford East in 9:31.8 over Peoria Woodruff's Bill Gillingham.

1957

Maywood Proviso unseats LaGrange Lyons in convincing fashion as coach Harold Monilaw's team scores 63 points, the lowest total since Urbana's record-setting effort in 1951.

For the second—and final time—in state history, runners from the same school place 1-2. Moline teammates Ray Ott and Bob Lindrud hold down the top two spots with Ott winning in 9:31.6 for 1.9 miles.

LaGrange Lyons winds up third, the fourth time in the decade of the '50s that the Lions placed among the state's top three teams. Lyons would be out of the top five for 15 years.

1958

After a five-year run by Chicago-area schools, Alton becomes the first downstate team to win the state title since Peoria Woodruff in 1952 when it edges Glen Ellyn Glenbard 95-100 at Urbana Country Club.

Through the first 13 years of the state meet, Chicago-area schools have won six state titles. Little did anyone realize at the time, but Alton's 1958 state title is the last a downstate team would record. In fact, from 1958 through 1994, only two schools

south of Interstate 80 placed in the top three in the one-class or Class AA state meets—Centralia, second in 1971, and Springfield Lanphier, third in 1982.

Marvin Silliman of Kankakee wins the 1.9-mile race at Urbana Country Club in 9:21, just ahead of a Winnetka New Trier sophomore named Weymouth Kirkland.

1959

With Kirkland leading the way, New Trier captures the only state cross country title in the school's storied state championship history 67-96 over a new school, Glen Ellyn Glenbard West.

Kirkland becomes the second runner in state history to go from second place one year to a state title the next, and he is only

junior. His winning time on the 1.9-mile Urbana Country Club course is 9:20.5. Allen Carius of Morton, who will go on to become one of the most successful college coaches in state history at North Central in Naperville, is second.

1960

Kirkland does what Sandoval wasn't able to do in 1955, win a second straight state title. He runs the fastest time in state meet history, 9:15 for 1.9 miles at Urbana Country Club, in beating Moline's Wiley Wright.

Glenbard West and New Trier flip-flop positions with the Glen Ellyn school claiming the state title 80-85.

Elmhurst York hires a new cross country coach this year, a fellow by the name of Joe Newton. Newton, a former sprinter at Northwestern, comes over from Waterman, a school that once employed Ernie Eveland.

1961

In the closest team race in state history, Highland Park edges Glenbard West 96-97, denying Glenbard West a chance to be the state's third repeat winner. And Evanston finishes third with 98 points.

The key performer for Highland Park is Jim Weinert, who gets the best number a runner can hope for, No. 1. Weinert's time over the now-2.0-mile Urbana Country Club course is 10:11.3. Dave Bartel of Wheaton is second.

Weinert was a two-time track mile champion, and his 1961 time of 4:16.2 was a state record at the time.

1962

Elmhurst York wins its first state title with 61 points to 98 for runner-up Evanston. New Trier is third with 100.

It starts innocently enough for the Dukes and Coach Newton. But a monster has been created.

Charles Schulz of Evanston takes individual honors in 9:57. Robert Barber of Skokie Niles West is second.

1963

Evanston's Schulz becomes the second repeat individual champion in state history as he tours the two-mile Urbana Country Club course in an impressive 9:30.9. Nobody has—or will—run faster for two miles in state meet history.

Scott Bakieda's second-place finish keys Chicago Lane Tech to its first state cross country title. It also is the only state cross country title ever won by a school from the Chicago Public League.

Glenbard West is second, the last in a run of six straight top-four finishes for the Glen Ellyn school. York fails to place among the state's top five schools. That's significant for one reason: the Dukes will be among the state's top five 31 times between 1962-94.

1964

Bruce Bowman leads Hillside Proviso West to its first state crown 46-68 over York. Chicago Lane is third with 109.

Bowman, a three-time top-five placer in the state track meet mile, runs 9:36.8 for 2.0 miles. John Greco of Des Plaines Maine West places second.

1965

Title No. 2 for York comes by the second-widest margin in state history so far, 64 points over Rockford Guilford (only Maywood Proviso's 70-point victory over Edwardsville in 1954 is larger).

Winnetka New Trier becomes the leader in individual state champions as Mike Collins takes individual honors in

9:53.4. Doug Williamson of Libertyville is second. Rick Wohlhuter, a future Olympian from St. Charles, isn't among the leaders.

1966

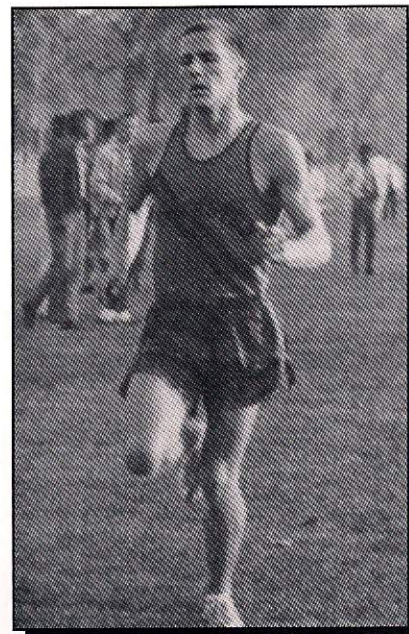
Evanston wins its second title and first since 1953, 117-124 over Naperville. It's the most points by a state champion up to that time.

The Urbana Country Club course is again shortened to 1.9 miles, and Jim Press of Riverside-Brookfield wins in 9:45.4. Dave Calvert of Rockford Guilford is second.

York places third with 127 points.

1967

In the last state meet run on the Urbana Country Club course, Arlington Heights Arlington edges Hillside Proviso



Charles Schulz of Evanston wowed the field in 1963, winning his second state title with a time of 9:30.9 over two miles. No one will break that mark, since the state meet is now run on a three-mile course.

West 73-74 for the title. York is third with 101, and Glenbard West returns to the top five with a fourth-place finish.

Lee LeBadie of Des Plaines Maine West, wins in 9:54.4 to beat Rich Elliott of Hillside Proviso West. Elliott had won the state's first two-mile track championship the previous spring, and he repeated his track title in the spring of 1968.

1968

In the first state meet contested at the University of Illinois Golf Course in Savoy since 1951, Elmhurst York wins its third state title 121-129 over Evanston. It takes nearly an hour to sort things out.

Ken Popejoy of Glen Ellyn Glenbard West, another future Olympian, wins in 13:26.3 for 2.75 miles and will go on to win the state track mile title in the spring. Duane Smith of Moline is second.

1969

The Champaign-Urbana area says farewell to the state meet as the U of I Golf Course at Savoy again serves as host for the 275-mile race.

Palatine Fremd, which has never even earned a spot in the top five up to now, wins 86-129 over York with Mount Prospect Prospect and Park Ridge Maine East tied for third with 146.

Dave Merrick of New Lenox Lincoln-Way establishes himself as one of the best distance runners of all time as he wins in 13:19.4. Andy Isla-Rubert of Hillside Proviso West, who would set the state mile record at 4:07.1 in the spring, is second.

1970

The state meet moves to Peoria's Detweiller Park, but it doesn't bother Dave Merrick. The course may be new and the distance (2.67 miles) may be a tad shorter, but Merrick becomes the third two-time winner in state meet history with a time of 12:37.6. Merrick will finish his high school career with five state titles, including the mile/two-mile double during the track season of 1971.

Dan Pettinger of Palatine Fremd is second in 12:50. And a skinny sophomore from Lebanon named Craig Virgin places sixth in 13:04.

Park Ridge Maine East unseats Palatine Fremd 129-139 for the team title.

1971

The three-mile distance is set at Detweiller Park, and it doesn't take long for Lebanon's Craig Virgin to set a lofty mark for others to chase.

Virgin, a junior, makes it look easy in winning his first state title in 13:59.3. Twenty-four years later, that still ranks as the fourth-fastest Detweiller Park time ever. Lee Erickson of New Lenox Lincoln-Way is second in 14:29.

York begins a run of three straight

state titles by a 67-136 margin over Centralia. Maine East is third with 137 and Riverside-Brookfield fourth with 138.

1972

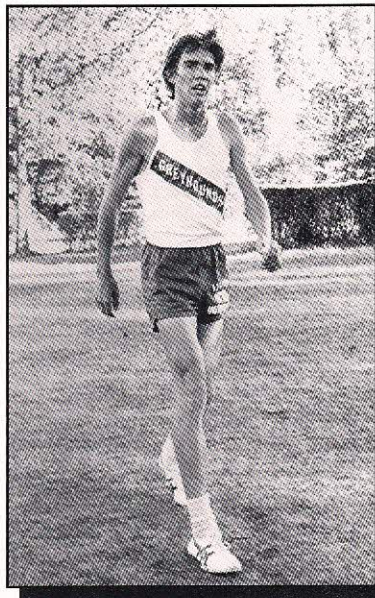
In the single most dominating performance in state history, Virgin runs 13:50.6 to claim his second state title and establish himself as America's top schoolboy distance runner.

"The most impressive thing I've ever seen at the state meet," York's Newton said about Virgin's record run. "He was at 4:19 at the mile...4:19...then 9:19 at the two-mile. He was 300 meters in front of everybody.

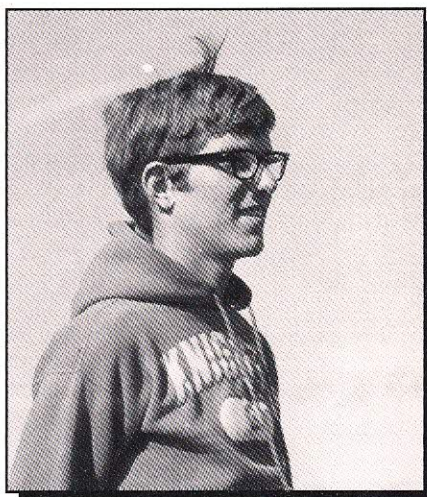
"That's the greatest thing I've ever seen. It was unbelievable. I'll never forget it."

The distant runner-up is Stan Vannier of Centralia, who runs 14:20.

Virgin will go on to be the first American finisher in eight NCAA track and cross country

finals. He was a two-time Olympian and two-time world champion in cross country. He won five high school state championships, including both the mile and two-mile at the 1972 state track meet.

York is again the team champion with 84 points, an 80-point margin over runner-up Arlington Heights Hersey.

1973

York makes it three in a row and six titles in the last 12 years in convincing fashion, beating runner-up Riverside-Brookfield 64-159.

New Lenox Lincoln-Way, which produced standout distance runners Dave Merrick and Lee Erickson in the previous five years, has another good one in Dave Walters. The senior wins in 13:57.7, which

remains the third-fastest time in Detweiller Park history. Bill Fritz of Glen Ellyn Glenbard West, a two-time state mile champion, is second in 14:06. Fritz's time ranks No. 6 all-time, and the 14:13 and 14:15 turned in Chris Young of Stillman Valley and Arnie Jackson of Schaumburg, respectively, rank No. 10 and No. 18 in state history.

1974

Chicago Heights Bloom ends Elmhurst York's bid to become the second four-time winner in state history with a 91-96 victory. York has its top two runners in front of Bloom's first runner, but Bloom's five scoring runners all finish ahead of York's No. 4.

Tom Marino of Hillside Proviso West wins in 14:14, 6 seconds ahead of York junior Ron Craker. Leo Lenting leads Bloom with a ninth-place finish.

1975

In perhaps the most controversial meet in state history, Bloom edges York 128-132 amid

claims that a Bloom runner cut the course. The IHSA conducted an investigation and found no wrongdoing.

Terry Bauer's 11th-place finish is tops for Bloom.

Ron Craker becomes York's first individual champion, running the sixth-fastest time in Detweiller Park history, 14:10. Rockford East's Dan Gilchrest is second in 14:12.

Two glimpses into the future: a sophomore from Orland Park Sandburg, Tom Graves, is third. And a youthful Deerfield team places third with 161. Both Graves and the Deerfield team will make a lot of noise over the next two seasons.

1976

The state meet is divided into two classes, and for the first time in history two state champions are crowned.

Deerfield beats Wheaton North 111-142 to capture its first state championship, and by the time the season is over Deerfield is named the nation's best high school cross country team. Keith Hampton runs No. 1 for Deerfield, placing 15th in 14:33.



Graves wins the first of his six state titles—four of them in track—in 14:08.5, the fifth-fastest time in meet history. Jim Spivey of Bensenville Fenton is second in 14:16, and the next five runners are separated by a mere four seconds.

In the inaugural Class A state meet, Lebanon wins with 96 points, returning most of the runners from the team that placed fifth in the final year of one-class cross country. Winnebago, led by state champion Doug Drogemuller (14:46.5), is second with 139 points. Terry Donahue of Lombard Montini is the Class A runner-up.

1977

If not for Craig Virgin's dominating performance in the 1972 state meet, people would call Tom Graves' effort in this year's meet the best ever. And Graves needs just about every second of his 13:56 performance to hold off Fenton's Jim Spivey.

Spivey comes through the first mile in 4:37 with Graves about 10 yards back. But Graves surges just past the mile mark, running the third half-mile in an unreal 2:05. Graves' 13:56 ranks No. 2 of all-time. Spivey, who was an Olympian after earning All-America honors at Indiana University, is second in 14:00, the fourth-best time ever. It is—and remains—the only time two runners break 14 minutes in the same race.

Deerfield, rated No. 1 in the nation all season, puts three runners among the first 13 placers to take its second straight team title with 71 points. And Deerfield does it without No. 2 man Mark McCallister, who drops out after a mile and a half due to an injury.

York is second with 134 points, and the teams finishing second through fifth are separated by just 46 points. It marks the second time in 14 years the McCallister family has gotten the best of York coach Joe Newton. Dick McCallister, the father of Deerfield twins Todd and Mark McCallister, coached Proviso West to the 1964 state title by 22 points over York.

The second Class A state title goes to Elmwood 118-140 over Beecher. Mark

Capelle of Highland St. Paul wins in 14:49.4 with Tom Stluka of Beecher second.

1978

This will be remembered as the year Elmhurst York regained the Class AA state title and the year juniors dominated the Class AA individual battle.

York put its five scoring runners among the first 34 finishers separated by 18 seconds to win its seventh state title. Villa Park Willowbrook is second with 139, Dolton Thornridge third with 141 and Palatine Fremd fourth with 144.

Don Volkey of Belvidere pulls away in the last half-mile to win in 14:16 over Deerfield's Tom Stevens (14:20). Then comes a group of juniors who will make things real interesting in 1979—third-place Mike Sokolowicz, fourth-place Dave Valentine, fifth-place Ralph Caron, sixth-place Larry Troemel and eighth-place Mike Kirk.

Winnebago takes the team title with 104 points with Aurora Central Catholic second with 113. Craig Hayden of Pittsfield, who trains on his own all season because his school doesn't have a full team, won the title in 14:53.4. Gary Bremer of Metropolis is second in 15:00.

1979

A third race is added to what the IHSA calls "The Greatest Harrier Chase In The Nation" when a one-class 2.1-mile girls race becomes a part of the state finals at Detweiller Park.

The Class AA individual field is billed the deepest in the 34-year history of the meet. But it is a relative unknown, Jim Files of Springfield Lanphier, who emerges as the state champion in 14:18.3. Files becomes the first state champion in the one-class or Class AA meets from south of Interstate 80 since Craig Virgin in 1972. Ralph Caron of Chicago Marist, who admits afterward that he didn't know who Files was, finishes second in 14:19.

Park Ridge Maine East unseats Elmhurst York 63-65 for the team title. It

ranks as Newton's No. 1 disappointment.

"Two Maine East guys passed our guy in the last 500," Newton said. "And we lost by two points."

Petersburg Porta has a new coach in Mike Johnson but returns all of the runners from its 1978 20th-place Class A team. The Bluejays put three runners among the first 22 finishers to capture the Class A title 78-136 over Princeton. Gary Bremer, the runner-up in 1978, wins in 14:49.2. Jeff Stipp of Hoopston-East Lynn is second in 14:54.

And the first female state cross champion in state history is sophomore Madlyn Morreale of Glen Ellyn Glenbard South in 11:34.9. Becky Cotta of Wheaton North places second in 11:37.4.

Wheeling wins the first team title with 91 points. Evanston is second with 169.

1980

History is made in the Class AA meet as Mike Patton of Chicago St. Ignatius becomes the first African-American to win a state cross country title.

Patton's time of 14:24.8 is just ahead of the 14:26 by runner-up Larry Head of Oak Park-River Forest and third-place Bob Dunphey of Schaumburg. Thirty-two runners break 15 minutes on the three-mile Detweiller Park course.

Elmhurst York is back on top 102-121 over Palatine.

While all eyes in the girls race are on defending champion Madlyn Morreale of Glen Ellyn Glenbard South, freshman Laura Haggerty of Evergreen Park is feeling no pressure. Haggerty wins in 11:43.6 for the 2.1-mile course, 1.4 seconds ahead of Jenny Spangler of Rockford Guilford.

Eric Volkert of Peoria Bergan, who hasn't run cross country before his senior year, wins the state title in 14:46.9 and leads the Trojans to their first state title 89-123 over Pecatonica. Mike Eisele of Woodstock Marian is second in 14:48.

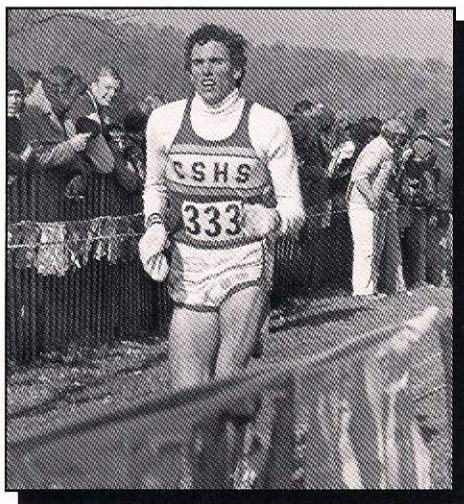
1981

Peoria Bergan and Elmhurst York are the favorites and live up to the pre-meet hype by repeating as state champs in Class A and Class AA, respectively.

York wins state title No. 9 by the widest margin in state history, 44-185 over runner-up Schaumburg. The Dukes have all five scoring runners among the top 29 finishers with a 30-second split.

Class AA individual honors go to Lockport's Jim Knudsen in 14:22.2, just 7 ahead of runner-up Ryan Stoll of Lak Forest.

Bergan is a repeat winner 92-111 over Trenton Wesclin. A pair of juniors, John

King of Elmhurst Immaculate Conception and Kirt Davis of Hoopston-East Lynn, finish 1-2. King wins in 14:49.6.

The third different individual and third different team are winners in the third girls race. Rockford Guilford (121) outdistances 1979 champion Wheeling (157) and Skokie Niles West (161).

Betsy Silzer, a hometown favorite from nearby Elmwood, wins in 11:22.9, the fastest time in girls state history up to that point. Madlyn Morreale of Glenbard West, the first girls state champion, is second this time in 11:26. Four of the top six placers in the girls race were state champions (1980 champion Haggerty was fifth and 1982 champion Shelly McBride was sixth).

1982

The Wednesday before the state meet, John Jacobson receives a phone call. It is Craig Virgin, and he wants to talk a little running with the Cornell High School senior.

Jacobson picks up enough pointers to win the Class A state title in 14:43.2, a record at that time. Jacobson runs the first mile in 4:37 and is at the two-mile mark in 9:44. Jacobson ruins John King's bid to become the first repeat winner in Class A history. King is second in 15:03.

Trenton Wesclin becomes the sixth different team to win the Class A title in seven years. Wesclin ends Peoria Bergan's two-year reign 91-134. Streator Woodland, the high school team with which Jacobson trained because his high school doesn't have a program, is third with 148.

The temperature is just 23 degrees at race time, but Elmhurst York coach Joe Newton has other things to worry about. Two of his runners are in a car wreck five

days before the state meet, and one of them can't run in the finals. But the Dukes, who bring 13 fan buses to the meet, still manage to win their third straight title and 10th overall 79-167 over Chicago St. Ignatius. Springfield Lanphier is third with 194.

Brent McLain of Benton, who finished ninth as a junior in the Class A state meet, wins the Class AA title in 14:39.5, just 5 ahead of second-place Rob Cull of Lombard Montini and third-place Andy Estes of Palatine. The first 13 finishers are separated by 10.5 seconds, and the first 29 placers are all within 20.5 seconds of each other.

Schaumburg becomes the fourth different girls team champion and Shelly McBride becomes the fourth different individual winner.

Schaumburg finishes with 97 points to 129 for Belvidere, 140 for Downers Grove North and 142 for Des Plaines Maine West.

McBride moves up five places from her freshman year to win in 11:36.8. Pam Quaranghi of Collinsville is second in 11:40.

1983

Pulling off what coach Joe Newton calls "the sweetest of all," Elmhurst York ties Paris' 1946-49 record by winning its fourth straight Class AA state title. And the Dukes do it the hard way.

Rated No. 5 in the state coming in, York puts five runners within 51 seconds to win its 11th title overall 137-145 over Rockford Guilford. Hoffman Estates Conant is third with 154.

The individual field is loaded after one of the most competitive 3,200-meter race in state track history the previous spring. Craig Van Dyke of Maywood Proviso East wins in 14:24 with Jim White of York second in 14:26. The top six finishers all are within four seconds.

Both the girls and Class A boys races feature repeat team champions and brand-new individual winners.

Wheeling, which won the first girls title in 1979, regains the crown 134-138 over Downers Grove South. Mary Driscoll of Elmhurst York becomes the second freshman in five years to win the state title in 11:26.4. Melissa Straza of Bloomington is second in 11:34.

Elmwood, the 1977 Class A state champion, regains the crown 62-147 over Erie. The next three teams in the tightly bunched pack are separated by eight points.

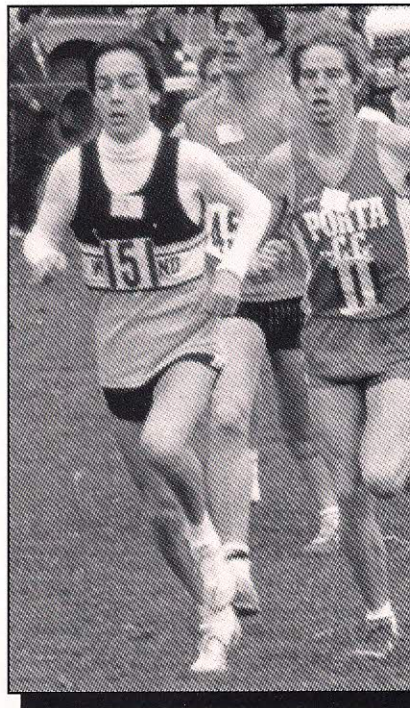
Ron Speletich of Beecher takes individual honors in 15:02.8, just .2 in front of runner-up John Stein of Peoria Bergan. The top 10 finishers all are within 10.2 seconds.

1984

And Elmhurst York stands alone.

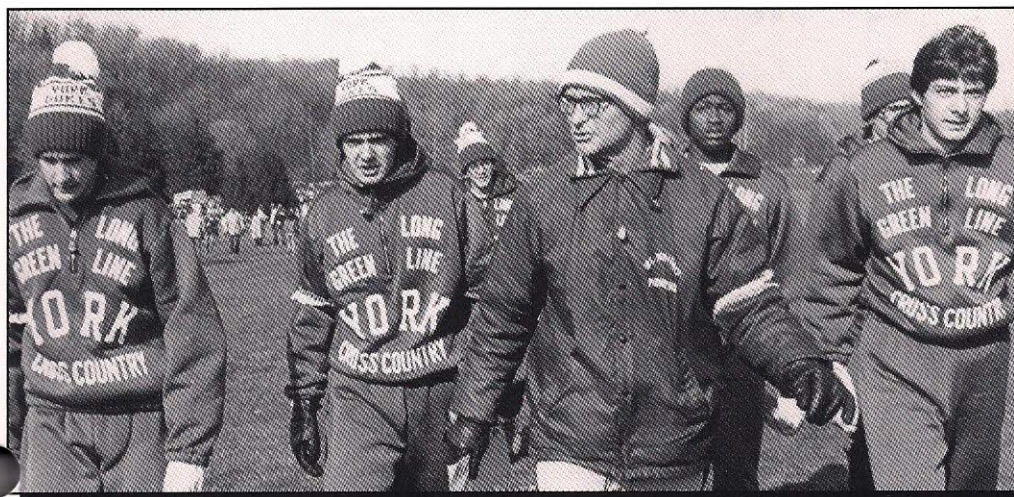
Coach Joe Newton's Dukes not only set a state record by winning their fifth straight title, but for the first time York has both the team and individual champion.

York finishes with 98 points. Rockford Guilford is second with

129 and Wheeling third with 197. Had it not been for the gut-wrenching 63-65 loss to Park Ridge Maine East in 1979, this would have been York's seventh straight state title.

Jim White, who had missed the spring track season with a broken ankle, becomes Newton's second individual champion, winning in 14:30.5. He picks up 28 places in the last half-mile.

Ed Slowikowski of Hinsdale South is second in 14:34.

Elmwood wins its second straight Class A title and its third overall 68-149 over Rushville. The next five teams are separated by 12 points.

The individual champion is Streator Woodland's Troy Maddux, who turns in the second-fastest Class A time of all-time, 14:35.1. Sophomore Tony Fernatt of Beecher is second in 14:57.

Wheeling sets the all-time girls state meet record by winning its second straight title and third overall with 50 points. Wheeling has the No. 1, 4, 23, 44 and 51 finishers, led by freshman state champion Dana Miroballi. Downers Grove North is second with 94 and Elmhurst York third with 146.

Miroballi becomes the second straight freshman and the third in the meet's six-year history to win the state title. Her time of 11:29.6 edges Tracy Laughlin (11:31).

1985

Elmwood makes a claim for best Class A program by winning its third straight Class A title and fourth overall 69-93 over Pontiac.

Troy Maddux makes his claim for best Class A runner of all-time by winning in 14:18.5, still the fastest Class A time ever and the 19th-fastest ever at Detweiller Park. Maddux, who trained with 1982 Class A champion John Jacobson, becomes the first repeat Class A state champion and the sixth two-time winner in state history.

Beecher's Tony Fernatt becomes the first runner in state history to finish second twice. His time is 14:47.

In Class AA, Schaumburg ends Elmhurst York's five-year reign thanks to a 34.8-second split between its top five finishers. The Saxons wind up with 116 points to 172 for Homewood-Flossmoor and 190 for Hoffman Estates Conant. York is fifth with 192.

Jim Gibson of Lake Forest, the top returnee, wins in 14:28. Mitch McCormick of Franklin Park Leyden is second in 14:38.6.

Dana Miroballi of Wheeling becomes the girls' first repeat winner by nearly 10

seconds. Miroballi's time is 11:29.5—she won in 11:29.6 as a freshman—and runner-up Alice Doyle, Miroballi's Wheeling teammate, finishes in 11:39.3.

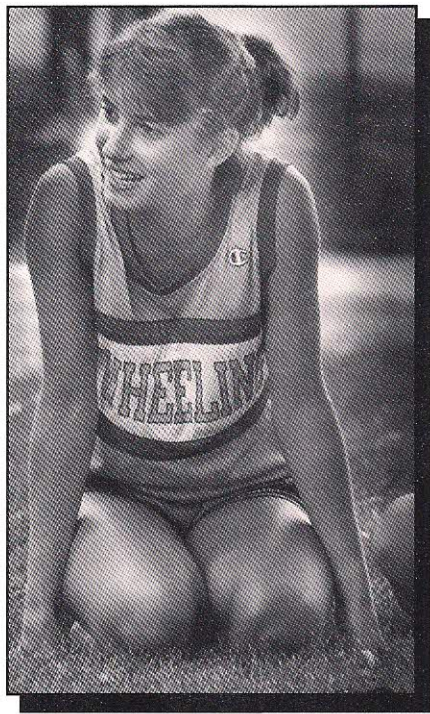
Downers Grove North wins its first title since 1980 131-146 over Palatine. Arlington Heights Hersey is third with 169.

1986

This is the year of the expected and the unexpected.

One of the things that is supposed to happen—Dana Miroballi of Wheeling winning her third straight girls state title—does. Miroballi's time of 11:31 is slower than her previous two winning performances but still 4 seconds faster than runner-up Katrina Price of Riverside-Brookfield.

The Wheeling girls do what comes naturally, too, winning an unprecedented fourth state crown and their third in the last four years. Wheeling has 123 to 143 for runner-up Schaumburg.



Wheeling's Dana Miroballi owned the state meet from 1984 to 1987, winning a unprecedented four titles. Her 1987 time of 11:16.0 still stands as the meet record.

The Class A individual race holds true to form, too, as Beecher's Tony Fernatt, twice a runner-up, finally gets a spot in the winner's circle. Fernatt's winning time is 14:42 with Todd Lopeman of top-ranked and class A champion Pontiac second in 15:07.

Pontiac has 85 and ends the three-year reign of Elmwood, which places second

with 139. Forreston also has 139 but Elmwood is awarded the second-place trophy based on the performance of each team's No. 6 runner:

In Class AA top-ranked defending state champion Schaumburg fails to even qualify for the state meet. But Elmhurst York doesn't really care. The Dukes score more points—155—than any other winning team in state history and have no runners among the first 25 finishers. But the Dukes use a 1-5 split of 33 seconds to win state title No. 13. Rockford Guilford is second with 161 and St. Charles third with 165.

Lenny Sitko of Niles Notre Dame is a runaway winner, finishing in 14:08. Dave Rill of Oak Park Fenwick is second in 14:23.

1987

A familiar face and two familiar names capture the headlines.

Dana Miroballi of Wheeling becomes the first runner, male or female, to win four straight state titles—nobody else ever won more than two—when she shatters the 2.1-mile Detweiller Park course record. Miroballi wins in 11:16, still the best time ever in the girls race, and Riverside-Brookfield's Katrina Price is second for the second year in a row, this time in 11:21. Price's time remains the second-fastest ever at Detweiller Park.

Scott Maddux, the brother of two-time Class A state champion Troy Maddux, makes it three state titles in four years for the Maddux family. The Streator Woodland senior rebounds from a disappointing 10th-place finish in 1986 to win in 14:48. Doug Light of Toledo Cumberland is second in 14:56.

The Class AA boys champion is no stranger to Detweiller Park. Metamora's Mark Scheirer ran five times on the 3.0-mile state meet course, and the last time is the sweetest as he beats Chicago Vocational's Aaron Rogers by three seconds for the state title. Scheirer is the first downstate champion since Brent McLain of Benton in 1982.

All three team champions are different from 1986. Schaumburg, the 1985 boys champion, regains the title 120-124 over Naperville Central. Hoffman Estates is able to hold off East St. Louis Lincoln 148-153 to capture its first girls state title. And Maple Park Kaneland has the easiest time of all, winning the Class A title 103-136 over Toledo Cumberland.

1988

A fourth race is added to the state meet package, a Class A girls state meet. And that suits Roger Beals just fine.

Beals pulls a first, becoming the first person to ever coach two state championship teams on the same day. Not that that should surprise anyone. Beals is the 14th-winningest boys basketball coach in state history with a career mark of 638-175.

Beals' girls team wins the first Class A title 74-103 over neighbor Tolono Unity. Karen Morris leads Chrisman with a third-place finish. The Chrisman boys team takes Class A honors 122-139 over Tremont thanks to a 1-5 split of just 21 seconds.

Chris Salsberry of Genoa-Kingston takes individual honors in the Class A girls race with a winning time of 12:22, 11 seconds ahead of Herscher's Jenny Kohl.

The Class A boys champion is Eric Detmer of Breese Mater Dei in 15:05. John Erickson of Eureka is second in 15:17.

The first Class AA girls race features a new champion as Erin Boland of McHenry romps in 11:42, a 24-second advantage over runner-up Lisa Winters of Arlington Heights Hersey.

Hoffman Estates Conant succeeds crosstown rival Hoffman Estates as state champion 139-158 over Downers Grove North.

And in the boys Class AA race, Schaumburg makes it two in a row and three state titles in four years with a 70-77 decision over Elmhurst York. Coach Jim Macnider's Saxons are able to overcome York's strong up-front attack (3-4-12-26) with a 19-second team split.

Like the other state champions of the day, Rock Island's Mario Vesey has an easy time winning by 13 seconds in 14:42 over Dan Nolan of Naperville Central.

1989

The Men of York are back in the winner's circle for the first time in three years, winning their 14th title 75-128 over Palos Hills Stagg. York turns the tables on two-time champion Schaumburg (fifth with 191 points), which has three runners among the first 15 finishers, by putting together a 20-second 1-5 split.

Bob Watson of Palatine wins in 14:35, 6 seconds ahead of Schaumburg's Scott Lilley.

The Class AA girls race features a surprise winner in East St. Louis Lincoln's Marques Sanders. Sanders, who clocks an 11:51 to win by 6 seconds, has spent much of her career running in the shadow of teammate Montrice Granberry, who is sixth at the state meet in 12:08. Tricia Huber of Palatine is second in 11:57.

Seneca becomes the a first-time Class A winner by outdistancing West

Frankfort 131-140. Herscher's John Eggenberger wins in 15:05, 14 seconds in front of David Lewis of Fairfield.

Winnebago knocks off defending Class A girls champion Chrisman 104-109 behind the runner-up performance of junior Rachel Knapp (12:24). Shelbyville senior Brooke Roberts wins in 12:22.

1990

Elmhurst York breaks its own record for largest margin of victory as it rolls to its second straight title and 15th overall 54-213 over runner-up Hoffman Estates. The Dukes' old mark for largest margin of victory had been 141 points in 1981.

York's 1-5 split is 35 seconds. Nobody in this race comes within 30 seconds of that split.

Russian foreign exchange student Vadim Nemad of Skokie Niles North wins in 14:17, the 17th-fastest time ever at Detweiller Park and the best time since Lenny Sitko's 14:08 in 1986. Nick Thiel of Naperville North is second in 14:36.

Erin Boland becomes just the second girl to win more than one state title as she captures the Class AA crown by 13 seconds in 11:30. Amy Siegel of Wheeling is second. Boland won the 1988 Class AA title but fell to ninth in 1989.

Palatine takes team honors with 65 points to 89 for runner-up Libertyville.

Top-ranked Tremont prevails in the Class A boys race 94-114 over West Frankfort. Chris Adesso of Wheaton St. Francis wins in 15:04 over Justin Weiss of Lisle.

Sparta's Becky Garrett turns in the fastest Class A girls time ever, 11:47, in winning over Palos Heights Chicago Christian's Laura Erffmeyer. Erffmeyer's 11:57 is the No. 2 Class A girls time ever.

The team title goes to St. Joseph-Ogden with 167 points to 186 for Hillsboro and 188 for Rock Island Alleman.

1991

The Palatine girls and the Elmhurst York boys each make it three in a row in Class AA.

The York boys roll to another lopsided Class AA title 76-161 over Schaumburg. Pat Joyce of Prairie View Stevenson takes individual honors in 14:41 with Scott Lidskin of Glenview Glenbrook South second in 14:47. York's 1-5 split is 23 seconds.

The Palatine girls make it two runner-up finishes for Schaumburg, outdistancing the Saxons 78-132. Erica Chesney of Downers Grove North wins in 12:06, and Wheeling's Amy Siegel is second for the second straight year, this time in 12:10.

Coach Jim Acklin's St. Joseph-Ogden boys team sets a record for fewest points ever by a Class A team with 46, and the Spartans do something no team in recent memory has ever done; they have an all-stater (top 25) not count in the team score. Tim Mies places 23rd in 15:51 and is awarded an individual medal. But he doesn't even count in the St. Joseph-Ogden team score.

Brad Kaufman of Tremont wins in 15:04, just 1 second ahead of Liberty's Jeff Obert.

And for the third year in a row there is a new Class A girls champion as Herscher places first with 120. Hillsboro repeats as the second-place team with 158, and Urbana University High is third with 159. The second-through sixth-place teams are separated by just five points.

Petersburg Porta's Heather Hollis, who runs strong all season, losing just once, takes individual honors in 12:17. Brittany Johnson of Lebanon is second in 12:22, just ahead of Gardner-South Wilmington's Treasure Schultz.

1992

It almost seems like the Palatine girls and Elmhurst York boys are competing against each other even though they never step on the course together.

Palatine wins its fourth straight Class AA girls title 66-142 over Carol Stream Glenbard North. A 36-second split makes it easy for Palatine.

Becky Coleman of Libertyville becomes the fourth straight senior to win a race once dominated by underclassmen as she finishes in 12:06. Jenny Zehr, a freshman from Arlington Heights Hersey, is second in 12:12.

The York boys win their fourth straight title, but it isn't as easy as the last two. York has 75 to 104 for St. Charles. Pat Joyce of Lincolnshire Stevenson becomes the seventh male repeat champion as he wins in 14:30. Chris Brown of Libertyville, Joyce's season-long rival, is second in 14:36.

The Class A boys and girls races also feature repeat team champions. Herscher wins its second straight girls crown 98-118 over Seneca, and the St. Joseph-Ogden boys squeeze out a 101-109 victory over Georgetown-Ridge Farm. Trenton Wesclin freshman Sue Gibson wins in 12:17 over Treasure Schultz of Gardner-South Wilmington. And in the boys race, German foreign exchange student Christian Natusch of Rushville completes an undefeated season by winning in 14:53. Barry Pearman of Georgetown-Ridge Farm is second in 14:57.

1993

Elmhurst York equals its own state record by winning its fifth straight Class AA boys state title, but there are some anxious moments as the Dukers have to take an uncharacteristic 83rd-place finish from their No. 5 runner.

Even with the big number, York finishes with 137 points to 204 for Palatine and 207 for Waukegan.

The individual race comes down to a couple of local guys, Tim Broe from just across the Illinois River from Detweiller Park in East Peoria and Adam White from Peoria Notre Dame. The two stay close throughout until Broe pulled away to win in 14:22. White is second in 14:31.

For the first time ever the boys and girls champions come from the same school as East Peoria junior Jenelle Deatherage wins the Class AA girls race in 11:43, a full 10 seconds ahead of Kristen Devaney of Naperville North.

It is Naperville North that ends Palatine's four-year stranglehold on the Class AA girls crown. Naperville North finishes with 78 to 86 for Palatine.

Winnebago wins a tightly contested Class A girls team race with 119 points. The top five teams are within 30 points of each other.

Sophomore Sue Gibson of Trenton Wesclin repeats here 1992 title with a time of 12:22. That was 5 seconds ahead of Christine Congo of Seneca.

A new champion is crowned in the Class A boys race as Lester Hampton's Normal University team slips past

Oregon 72-82. Chris Bailey of Westmont wins in 14:55, and Eureka's Jeff Erickson winds up second in 15:08.

1994

Three of the four team champions are repeat winners, including Elmhurst York, which establishes a Class AA as well as an all-time state record by winning for the sixth straight time.

York finishes with 139 to 176 for runner-up Mount Prospect Prospect. Palatine Fremd is back in the hunt after a bit of an absence with 182.

Newton's 38-year run at York is unprecedented in state history for any sport. His cross country teams have won 1,699 dual meets for a 93 percent winning mark. They've won 178 conference championships in track and cross country. He is a member of eight halls of fame.

Tim Broe of East Peoria repeats as the boys Class AA champion in 14:52 over Lou Petricca of Prospect (14:59). But Broe's female counterpart, East Peoria's Jenelle Deatherage, isn't able to make it two years in a row of two state champs for East Peoria. Deatherage winds up 35th in the Class AA girls race as Cassidy Wall of Lemont Mount Assisi wins in 11:43. Elizabeth Kampf of Decatur MacArthur is second in 12:05.

Carol Stream Glenbard North wins its first girls Class AA title with 94 points. Palatine is second for the second year in a row after winning four straight titles.

Normal University is able to defend its Class A boys title, winning 89-149 over Sandwich. Chris Bailey of Westmont

becomes the eighth two-time boys state champion with a winning time of 14:52. Matt McClelland of Rushville is second in 15:27.

The Winnebago girls also defend a Class A title, outlasting Westmont 83-130 for the crown. Susan Paige of Elmwood wins in 12:16 over Petersburg Porta freshman Stacy Sullivan (12:23). Trenton Wesclin's Sue Gibson, trying for a third straight Class A title, finishes third.

About the Author

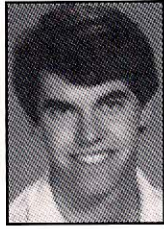

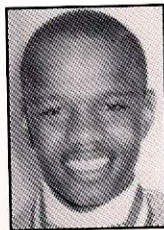
