

MSHS cross country squad running like chariots ablaze

Mahomet-Seymour High School girls cross country squad narrowly beat out Olympia for a second place finish at the Corn Belt Conference on October 14. The running Bulldogs edged Olympia by one point, by a score of 49-48.

Bulldog Maureen Scott earned individual champ honors with her time of 15:36 for a two-and one-half mile course. Scott's teammate, Courtney Philbrook found herself in the top 10, placing seventh, with a time of 16:48.

Scott's sibling, Mary, placed eighth, coming in with a time 16:51. Jessica Schroeder, who battled injuries all year, finished in 15th place with a time 17:26, while Tabitha Haley came in six seconds behind her.

Lydia Morris and Melody Smith posted times of 17:49 and 17:52 respectively, while Rachel Schildt and Megan Scott posted

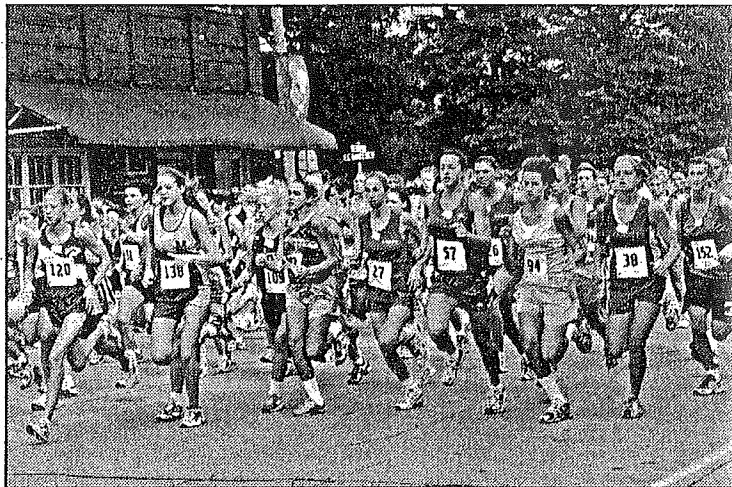

tuned in a championship performance. The sole All Conference placer ran the three-mile course in 15:56. Teammate Taylor Sebestik placed 16th, posting a time of 17:33.

Fellow runners Alex Smith and Wes Logan placed 21st and 30th respectively, posting times of

October 7 at Parkland College's two and one-half mile course. It was definitely the Lady Bulldogs' day. They placed second out of 12 full teams.
