## 6 Bulldogs run season-best times

Mahomet-Seymour The boys' cross-country team placed ninth among 64 full teams, with 317 points, in the varsity race Saturday at the Richard Spring Invitational at Peoria's Detweiller Park.

Despite the hot and humid weather, six Bulldog runners ran season-best times. Three Bulldogs earned medals.

"As far as the meet, it was our toughest of the year," coach Neal Garrison said. "We were able to beat all the AA state-ranked teams, so we were happy about that.

"It was the first time we faced No. 2 state-ranked Normal U-High. They are a team filled with great runners with great coaching. It is always nice to be able to compete with such a fine program."

Mathias Powell (14 minutes, 51.9 seconds), Ryan Hodge (15:07.2) and Riley Fortune (15:31.5) each earned a medal and ran season-best times alongside the strong competi-

Powell placed sixth, Hodge 14th and Fortune 39th in the 3-mile event.

Bryson Keeble's season-best (15:58.7) placed him 77th.
