Mahomet-Sevmour boys' cross-country team officially placed second in the Class 2A Metamora Regional which featured seven state-ranked teams at Black Partridge Park the fastest time any last Saturday.

The Bulldogs tied Normal University High for first with 49 points, but the Pioneers' sixth-place runner broke the tie.

The runner-up team finish qualified the Bulldogs' squad for the sectional meet at Normal's Maxwell Park at 11:30 a.m. Saturday.

"Our team had the most amount of allregional runners we have had with three runners earning that honor," head coach Neal Garri-

To earn all-regional honors, junior Mathias Powell, senior Ryan Hodge and senior Riley Fortune placed in the top five spots.

Powell was regional titlist with a personalrecord time of 14 minutes, 33.82 seconds for the course, which is slightly less than 3

"Mathias Powell ran Mahomet runner has run in the regional meet," Garrison said.

Hodge followed in second place with a time of 14:39.85.

"Ryan Hodge ran the fastest time any Mahomet senior runner has run in the regional meet," Garrison said.

Powell and Hodge earned a spot on Metamora's top 25 list for runners running the fastest times on that course, dating back 40 years and including any meet the

"Nate Douglas improved 19 seconds from his previous best to run in the 16s for his second time," Garrison said.

Kyle Sheehy ran a season-best 17:17.93 for 49th place.

"Our team set some important team records, showing continued improvement from previous years of our program," Garrison said.

The Bulldogs had the fastest top-five runner time average (15:17.4) that any M-S team has had since first entering the IHSA regional meet 48 years ago.

The Bulldogs also had the fastest top-seven runner time average that any Bulldog team has had (15:36.8).
