H. A. WILSON, the English distance runner who competed in the United States during the outdoor season of 1909 under the colors of the Irish-American Athletic Club, is one of the best mile runners in competition.

At the Olympic games held at London in 1908, Wilson won a trial heat in fast time, but in the final had to bow to the superior speed of America's premier runner, Melvin Shepard, and in this event forced him to break the record for the distance to win.
