Harry Hillman, of the New York Athletic Club, is without a peer over the low hurdles and also in the quarter mile and 600-yard runs.

Hillman first came into prominence at the World's Fair held at St. Louis in 1904, winning the 200 and 400-meter hurdles and the 400 meters on the flat. Hillman was National A. A. U. quarter-mile champion in 1903 and again in 1908. He was a member of the 1906 and 1908 Olympic teams.

Owing to an injury received on shipboard on the way to Athens in 1906, Hillman was unable to do himself justice, and consequently was not placed in the 400-meter race. At London in 1908, Hillman was just beaten out of first place by a foot in the 400-meter hurdle race.
