JAMES P. SULLIVAN, of the Irish-American Athletic Club, who is well known as "4.22 Jim" was the first native born American to run the mile in the fast time of 4 minutes 22 seconds at the Metropolitan Championships held at Travers Island in 1905. In 1907 Sullivan won the Senior National A.A.U. one mile championship, and in the same year won the Military Athletic League title at the same distance. In 1909 Sullivan won the three mile Canadian Championship held at Montreal, and unfortunately pulled two tendons in his right ankle, which put him out of competition for the indoor season of 1909-1910.
