## LAWSON ROBERTSON

Lawson Robertson, of the Irish-American Athletic Club, a member of the 1906 and 1908 Olympic teams, will go down in athletic history as one of the greatest sprinters of the cinder path.

Robertson, as a member of the I. A. A. C. and of the Thirteenth Regiment of Brooklyn, won the 220-yard Junior National Championship in 1903, and in 1904, won the 100-yard A. A. U. National Championship.

As a board floor runner Robertson showed at his best, winning the 300-yard championship a number of times. In 1908, Robertson won the 100-meter Olympic trail at Philadelphia, Pa., equaling the world's record for the distance.

In the spring of 1908, Robertson made a new record for the 65-yard dash, his time being 7 seconds.
