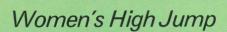

Women's High Jump



Few Olympic Records

The length of the competition, nervous tension and not always favorable atmospheric conditions mean that the women's world record for the high jump has rarely been broken at the Olympic Games. Since the end of the Second World War. it has only been achieved once, by the American girl Mildred McDaniel in 1956 in Melbourne, with 1.76 m (5 ft 9 in), In 1972 in Munich, the young West German girl Ulrike Meyfarth won the Olympic title, equalling the Austrian Ilona Gusenbauer's record of 1.92 m (6 ft 3 1/2 in), the latter having to be content with the bronze medal. Second at the Olympic meeting, the Bulgarian Yordanka Blagoeva would improve the record by 2 cm (3/4 in) a few days after the end of the Games.

The Rumanian girl Yolanda Balas broke the world record (which she had held from 1958 to 1971) thirteen times running. She was twice Olympic Champion, in Rome in 1960 with 1.85 m (6 ft 1 in) and in Tokyo in 1964 with 1,90 m (6 ft 3 in). In each of her victories she stuck at 1 cm from the record which she then held. It was in Bucharest, however, in front of her own public, that the remarkable Rumanian achieved most of her best world performances.
